1. PUBLIC HEARINGS/BILLS ELIGIBLE FOR THIRD READING – (ENACTMENT)

<u>CB-3-2009 (DR-2) - AN ACT CONCERNING TAXICAB REGULATIONS</u> for the purpose of amending provisions of the Code relating to regular taxicab rates and the emergency fuel cost surcharge. - <u>PUBLIC HEARING HELD; ENACTED</u>

Pursuant to proper notice, the public hearing convened on Council Bill 3 (DR-2). 9 persons spoke in support of Council Bill 3 (DR-2). All persons wishing to speak having done so, the public hearing was declared held. Council Member Dernoga moved enactment of Council Bill 3 (DR-2) seconded by Council Member Dean. The motion carried 8-0. (Absent: Council Member Exum.

<u>CB-5-2009 – AN ACT CONCERNING AMENDING THE ENERGY REAL PROPERTY</u> TAX CREDIT for the purpose of amending the tax credit for real property for residential homeowners who utilize solar energy conservation devices.

- <u>PUBLIC HEARING HELD; ENACTED</u>

Pursuant to proper notice, the public hearing convened on Council Bill 5. No persons wishing to speak, the public hearing was declared held. Council Member Olson moved enactment of Council Bill 5; seconded by Council Member Dernoga. The motion carried 8-0. (Absent: Council Member Exum.)

CB-6-2009 – AN ACT CONCERNING THE PROHIBITION OF THE SALE, OFFER OR DISTRIBUTION OF CERTAIN CIGAR PRODUCTS for the purpose of amending the provisions of the County Code prohibiting the sale, offer or distribution of cigar and cigar products intended for or designed for the use in ingesting, inhaling or otherwise introducing marijuana, cocaine, hashish, or hashish oil into the human body to minors and in quantities fewer than packages of five. - PUBLIC HEARING HELD; ENACTED

Pursuant to proper notice, the public hearing convened on Council Bill 6. Mr. Bryon Marshall, Ms. Sylvia Quinton and Mr. Thomas Hicks Hamper spoke in support of Council Bill 6. All persons wishing to speak having done so, the public hearing was declared held. Chairperson Bland announced that she was in receipt of three letters in support of Council Bill 6. Council Member Dean moved enactment of Council Bill 6; seconded by Council Member Knotts. The motion carried 8-0. (Absent: Council Member Exum).

<u>CR-9-2009 (DR-2) – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING VICTORY CREST SENIOR</u>
<u>APARTMENTS</u> for the purpose of approving a \$1.3 million HOME Loan for the Victory Crest Senior Apartments project and amending the Prince George's County "Annual Action Plan: FY 2006" and "Annual Action Plan: FY 2009" to include project and project funding.
