## PUBLIC SAFETY & FISCAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT Date: 10/21/99

Committee Vote: Favorable, 5-0, (In favor: Council Members Wilson, Hendershot, Maloney, Russell and Scott).

CB-87-1999 (DR-1) – Summary

Prince George's County and Council 67, AFSCME and its affiliated Local 2462 have completed labor negotiations on a two year labor agreement covering employees in the Fire/EMS Department Apparatus Maintenance bargaining unit during Fiscal Years 2000 and 2001. This bill will adopt and approve the referenced collective bargaining agreement in accordance with Section 16-233(f)(17) of the Personnel Law.
