A RESOLUTION concerning			
2010 Census			

For the purpose of expressing the importance of the 2010 Census and the impact it will have on our funding and quality of life for years to come.

WHEREAS, every ten (10) years, the U.S. Census Bureau is required by Article I, Section 2 of the Constitution of the United States to conduct a count of the all residents of the United States, including peoples of all ages, races, ethnic groups, citizens and non-citizens, and provides an historic opportunity for Prince George's County, Maryland, to help shape the foundation of our society and play an active role in American democracy; and

WHEREAS, Prince George's County is committed to ensuring that every resident is counted; and

WHEREAS, more than \$400 billion per year in federal and state funding is allocated to communities, and decisions are made on matters of national and local importance based on census data, including but not limited to healthcare in the form of planning for new hospitals, community development and housing such as the block grant program, education, after-school programs, transportation, designation of urban revitalizations areas, social services, and employment; and

WHEREAS, an accurate count of the population of Prince George's County is critical to ensure the County gains the maximum advantage when competing for federal dollars, making plans for future initiatives and projects, and reapportioning state and federal elected seats; and

WHEREAS, an accurate census count is vital to the ethnic heritage African community and other residents' well-being by helping planners, policymakers, grant-making foundations, and

corporations make important community development decisions; and

WHEREAS, achieving an accurate and complete count of America's growing and changing demographics will benefit under-served, hard-to-reach immigrant populations while expanding opportunities for service agencies and organizations; and

WHEREAS, the 2010 Census will create hundreds of thousands of jobs across the nation; and

WHEREAS, every Census Bureau worker takes a lifetime oath to protect confidentiality and ensure that data identifying respondents or their household are not released or shared for 72 years in order to achieve the intent of the census to count every person in the United States, citizens and non-citizens alike, regardless of immigration status; and

WHEREAS, a united voice from businesses, government, community-based and faith-based organizations, educators, media and others will allow the 2010 Census message to reach a broader audience, providing trusted advocates who can spark positive conversations about the 2010 census.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that Prince George's County supports the goals and ideals for the 2010 Census and will disseminate and encourage others to disseminate 2010 Census information to encourage participation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council hereby encourages all County agents and employees to partner together with the U.S. Census Bureau to achieve an accurate and complete count.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council further encourages the citizens of Prince George's County to participate in events and initiatives that will raise overall awareness of the 2010 Census and increase participation among all populations.
