Ordinance

Resolution and Ordinance of the City of Glenarden, to repeal and re-enact Chapter 149, "Vehicles and Traffic", Article V, "Vehicle Repairs on Private or City-Owned Property", §149-25 "Unregistered Vehicles" and §149-26 "Inoperative Vehicles" to prohibit the parking, storage or leaving of any vehicle with an expired, revoked, canceled or suspended certificate of title, or registration card or plate, on private property unless enclosed in a garage, to reduce the time during which a inoperative vehicles may be present on private property not zoned for such storage from 72 to 24 hours, and to delete the exception for inoperative vehicles stored in an auto cover.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 23A of the Annotated Code of Maryland and Section 602 of the Charter of the City of Glenarden, the Council has the power to pass all such ordinances as it may deem necessary for the protection of the health of the City and its inhabitants; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have regulated the use of public streets and sidewalks to ensure the health and safety of the residents of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have, by reason of Article 28, Section 8-112.1, of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended, been given the authority to regulate residential parking and storage; and

WHEREAS, the Council has determined that certain changes are required with respect to the parking and storage of vehicles on private property.

Section 1: Be it resolved and ordained by the Council of the City of Glenarden that Chapter 149, "Traffic and Vehicles", Article V, §149-25 "Unregistered Vehicles" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Glenarden be repealed and re-enacted as follows:

§149-25 Unregistered Vehicles.

It shall be unlawful to park, store or leave any vehicle, the certificate of title, registration card or registration plate of which was expired, revoked, canceled or suspended, or for the owner of any such vehicle to allow, permit or suffer the same to be parked, stored or left, whether attended or not, UPON ANY PRIVATE PROPERTY UNLESS ENCLOSED IN A GARAGE, OR upon any public street, highway, alley, or parking lot within the City of Glenarden for a period longer than 24 hours.

5 Section 2: Be it further resolved and ordained by the Council of the City of  
6 Glenarden that Chapter 149, "Traffic and Vehicles", Article V, §149-26 "Inoperative  
7 Vehicles" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Glenarden be repealed and re-enacted  
8 as follows:

10 §149-26 Inoperative Vehicles.

13 B. The parking or storing of any inoperative vehicle which is dismantled, damaged,  
14 wrecked or unsightly, of every kind of description, upon residentially zoned  
15 property or any other property not zoned for such storage within the corporate  
16 limits of the City of Glenarden for a period of time longer than [72] 24 hours  
17 after said inoperative vehicle becomes dismantled, damaged, wrecked or  
18 unsightly, unless said vehicle is stored in an [~~and auto cover or~~] enclosed  
19 garage, is hereby prohibited.

23 **NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, by the City Council of  
24 Glenarden, Maryland on this 14<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2008 that this ordinance shall be submitted  
25 to the Prince George's County Council within five days after its approval by the Mayor or  
26 passage by the Council over the Mayor's veto and shall become effective at the expiration  
27 of twenty calendar days following review and approval by the Prince George's County  
28 Council.
