PZED Committee Report

Committee Vote: Favorable, 4-0 (In favor: Council Members Dean, Knotts, Bland, and Olson)

Staff explained that the legislation amends the Use Tables for Comprehensive Design Zones in the Zoning Ordinance to permit a Country Inn in the L-A-C (Local Activity Center) Zone provided the use is located on a property with an existing home having at least 25,000 square feet of enclosed area. This Zoning Ordinance clarification is consistent with Amendment No. 2 in the Westphalia Sector Plan Resolution of Approval (CR-2-2007).

The Office of Law reviewed CB-94-2010 and determined that the bill is in proper legislative form with no legal impediments to its adoption.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT:

This bill will clarify that that a Country Inn, as defined in Section 27-107.01 of the Zoning Ordinance is a permitted use in the L-A-C Zone when the proposed use is on a property that has an existing home with at least 25,000 square feet of enclosed area. This clarification will comport with Amendment No. 2 in the Westphalia Sector Plan Resolution of Approval (CR-2-2007).
