This legislation will establish the homestead property tax credit for the County property tax for the taxable year beginning July 1, 2025, as required by State law. Based on the official Consumer Price Index (CPI) for June 2024, the Homestead Property Tax Credit needs to be set at 103% for the taxable year beginning July 1, 2025, based on the limit in Section 812(d) of the County Charter which caps growth at 105%. The Homestead Property Tax Credit was created to limit taxable assessment increases on a property owner's principal residence.

This Bill seeks to amend the Housing Code to allow for the following: (1) the Department to require proof of a license exemption for a landlord; (2) the suspension of a license for a violation of Subtitle, 4 Subtitle 5, Subtitle 11, Subtitle 13, or

Subtitle 27, of the Code; (3) deny the issuance of a rental license for failure to have a Use and Occupancy Permit; (4) increase the fines for violation of this Section; and (5) allow for the issuance of administrative citations and administrative Hearings.
