CB-69-2006 - AN ACT CONCERNING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF **SPECIAL OBLIGATION BONDS** for the purpose of providing that one or more series of special obligation bonds may be issued from time to time under the provisions of this Act, Article 41, Sections 14-201 through 14-214 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended (2003 Replacement Volume and 2005 Supplement) (the "Tax Increment Act"), and pursuant to Section 10-269 of the Prince George's County Code, as amended (2003 Edition, 2005 Supplement) and Section 9-1301 of Article 24 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended (2005 Replacement Volume) (collectively, the "Special Taxing District Act") and Resolution CR-65-2006 of the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland (the "Formation Resolution") in an amount not to exceed the aggregate principal amount of One Hundred Ninety Million Dollars (\$190,000,000) in order for the County to finance the construction of the parking improvements and infrastructure improvements as more particularly described herein; making certain findings and determinations, among others, concerning the public benefit and purpose of such special obligation bonds; providing that such special obligation bonds authorized to be issued hereby shall be payable, from the amounts levied and deposited in the Tax Increment Fund (as defined in the Formation Resolution) and any other tax revenues deposited therein and that the special obligation bonds shall not constitute a general obligation debt of the County or a pledge of the County's full faith and credit or taxing power other than the taxes representing the levy on the Tax Increment (as defined in the Formation Resolution); authorizing the County Executive of the County to specify, prescribe, determine, provide for and approve certain details, forms, documents or procedures in connection with such special obligation bonds issued hereunder and any other matters necessary or desirable in connection with the authorization, issuance, sale and payment of such special obligation bonds and make certain commitments on behalf of the County in connection with the issuance, sale and delivery of such special obligation bonds; authorizing the execution and delivery of such special obligation bonds and such other documents as may be necessary and desirable to effectuate the financing of the infrastructure improvements and the issuance, sale and delivery of such special obligation bonds; and generally providing for, and determining various matters in connection with, the issuance, sale, delivery and payment of such special obligation bonds.
