RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

Feasibility Study for a County-Owned Grocery Store Pilot Program

For the purpose of authorizing the development and completion of a six-month feasibility study to evaluate the potential for establishing a County-owned and operated grocery store in Prince George's County; assessing site selection, financial viability, operational models, and community impact; and ensuring the store operates on a cost-neutral basis to the County.

WHEREAS, Prince George's County is committed to addressing food insecurity and eliminating food deserts within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, several areas in the County lack equitable access to affordable, healthy, and culturally appropriate food options; and

WHEREAS, models in other jurisdictions such as Baldwin, Florida and Tulsa, Oklahoma have demonstrated that publicly supported or owned grocery stores can be viable tools for increasing food access in underserved communities; and

WHEREAS, the County seeks to explore an innovative, community-centered solution to address food access without imposing long-term financial burdens on the County's general fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that:

(A) Feasibility Study Authorization

The Council hereby authorizes the initiation of a six-month feasibility study led by the [Office of Central Services] <u>Redevelopment Authority</u> and the Economic Development Corporation (EDC), in partnership with the Department of Housing and Community

1	Development (DHCD), the Prince George's County Food Equity Council, and relevant
2	stakeholders.
3	(B) Scope of Study
4	(1) The study shall evaluate:
5	a. Viable locations using County-owned or easily acquired property; and
6	b. Capital and operational cost estimates; and
7	c. Funding sources (e.g., American Rescue Plan Act Grants and Community
8	Development Block Grants); and
9	d. Ownership and management models (public, nonprofit, hybrid); and
10	e. Projected revenue and operational expenses; and
11	f. Strategies for maintaining a cost-neutral operation; and
12	g. Community needs, input, and equity impact.
13	(C) Reporting Requirement.
14	A comprehensive report shall be submitted to the County Council within six-months of
15	the adoption of this Resolution. The report shall include recommendations on the viability of
16	proceeding with a pilot grocery store, including financial models and implementation timelines.
