(a) Pursuant to	Section 21-706.1 of the Transportation Article of the Annotated Code of

1 (b) The Chief of Police, in consultation with the Board of Education, is authorized to install, 2 operate, and maintain school bus monitoring cameras on school buses as permitted by 3 Section 21-706.1 of the Transportation Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland. 4 (c) A person who commits a violation recorded by a school bus monitoring camera is subject to 5 a civil penalty of [One Hundred and Fifty Dollars \$150.00] Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00). Future revisions of the District Court of Maryland Administrative Regulation shall 6 7 be reflected in the civil penalty for School Bus Monitoring violation. See Exhibit 1-Uniform 8 Citation Letter. 9 All school bus monitoring cameras shall conform to, and be used in accordance with the (d) 10 requirements of the Transportation Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland. 11 (e) The County shall use any fines collected by the County for a violation recorded by a school 12 bus monitoring camera to: 13 (1) Recover the costs of installing, operating, and maintaining school bus monitoring 14 cameras; and 15 (2) For public safety purposes, including pedestrian safety programs. 16 17 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby 18 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, 19 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of 20competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining 21 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this 22 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such 23 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, 24 or section. 25 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect on October 1, 26 2022/forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law/the effective date of CB-##-2022.
