2	Nursing Mother's Right to Feed
3	For the purpose of clarifying all mothers' right to breast-feed in County buildings and /or
4	property and requiring lactation rooms in certain County buildings and /or property and
5	establishing certain requirements for employers with nursing employees.

11	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
12	Maryland, that Sections 12-168, 12-169, 12-170, 12-171 and 12-172 of the Prince George's
13	County Code be and the same are hereby added:
14	SUBTITLE 12. HEALTH.
15	DIVISION 7. [Reserved.] Breast-feeding of Children.
16	SUBDIVISION 1. STATE REQUIREMENTS.
17	Sec. 12-168. Breast-feeding.
18	(a) In general. – A mother may breast-feed her child in any public or private location in
19	which the mother and child are authorized to be.
20	(b) Restriction of right prohibited . – A person may not restrict or limit the right of a
21	mother to breast-feed her child.

1	SUBDIVISION 2. LACTATION ROOMS IN COUNTY BUILDINGS.
2	Sec. 12-169 Definitions.
3	(a) As used in this Division.
4	(1) County Building shall mean any building and /or property owned, operated or
5	managed by Prince George's County. County Property does not include property owned or
6	managed by the Prince George's County Board of Education.
7	(2) Covered County Building shall mean a County building and /or property that is open
8	to the public and contains a public restroom.
9	(3) Lactation Room shall mean a hygienic place other than a bathroom, that:
10	(A) is shielded from view;
11	(B) is free from intrusion; and
12	(C) contains a chair, a working surface, and, if the County building and /or property
13	is otherwise supplied with electricity, an electrical outlet.
14	Sec. 12-170. Lactation Room Required.
15	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b), Prince George's County shall ensure that the
16	County building and /or property contains a lactation room that is made available for use by
17	members of the public to express breast milk.
18	(b) Exceptions. A covered public building and /or property may be excluded from the
19	requirement in subsection (a) if:
20	(1) the County building and /or property –
21	(A) does not contain a lactation room for employees who work in the building;
22	and
23	(B) does not have a room that could be repurposed as a lactation room or a space
24	that could be made private using portable materials, at a reasonable cost; or
25	(2) new construction would be required to create a lactation room in the County
26	building and the cost of such construction is unfeasible.
27	Sec. 12-171. No Unauthorized Entry.
28	Nothing in this section shall be construed to authorize an individual to enter a County
29	building or portion thereof that the individual is not otherwise authorized to enter.
30	SUBDIVISION 3. EMPLOYERS.
31	Sec. 12-172. Requirements for Working Nursing Mothers.

(a) An Employer shall provide:

(1) reasonable break times for an employee to express breast milk for her nursing child for one (1) year after the child's birth each time such employee has a need to express the milk; and

(2) a place, other than a bathroom, that is shielded from view and free from intrusion from coworkers and the public, which may be used by an employee to express breast milk. SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section. SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
