NEW BULKY TRASH COLLECTION PROGRAM



Starting February 14, we're rolling out a faster and improved curbside bulky trash collection pickup that will allow residents to set out two (2) items per week with their regular trash for pickup from your County provided trash hauler. White goods/large appliances or scrap tires will still need to be scheduled for an appointment online and through PGC311.

To help us prepare for the exciting changes, all scheduled bulky trash collections made online or through PGC311 will end January 21 (all scheduled collections up until that date will be honored).

YOUR SCHEDULED CURBSIDE COLLECTION DAY


Residents will be able to place **two (2) items OR two (2) bags** for collection
next to their trash cart for collection on
their regularly scheduled curbside trash
and recycling collection day. Bulky
items **NOT PLACED NEXT TO TRASH CART WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.**





RECYCLING AND TRASH

2 BULKY ITEMS





Residents will still need to schedule appointments for all white goods (appliances) and scrap tires online or via PGC311.
Residents who only pay for bulky trash collection services or subscribe to private trash collection services will continue to schedule bulky trash pickup via PGC311.

SCHEDULED PICKUP

YOUR SCHEDULED CURBSIDE COLLECTION DAY

Instead of scheduling a separate bulky trash pickup, residents will be able to place **two (2) items** next to their trash cart or bags for collection on their regularly scheduled curbside trash and recycling collection day.





2 BULKY ITEMS



Residents will still be able to schedule appointments for all white goods (appliances) and scrap tires online and through PGC311.

SCHEDULED PICKUP

The New Process (2items picked up on regular trash day) Applies ONLY to residences that receive County Trash collection Services

The new process only applies to homes that receive County weekly trash collection, not those who only receive Recycling or Bulky

Residents who ONLY receive bulky services, will continue to schedule pickups through 311

The new process only applies to homes that receive County weekly trash collection

Residents who live in a Municipality, and receive services through their Town/City/etc. will continue to follow their current process

The new process only applies to homes that receive County weekly trash collection

THE BENEFITS

- Less scheduling wait time.
- Can place two (2) oversized items
 OR two (2) trash bags with smaller
 items NEXT to trash cart/can for
 pickup.
- Residents can schedule a pickup of four (4) scrap tires and four (4) whites/appliances for curbside collection via PGC311.
- Reduces temptation of illegally dumped items.
- Residents receiving Countycontracted trash services ONLY, can participate. (those who receive only bulky will still schedule)

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS ? of the New Bulky Trash Collection Program











It cuts down on scheduling wait time, so now, you don't have to hold on to that big bulky item or bagged items in bulk that add clutter to your home. You can place it at the curb for collection on your regular trash day!



You can place up to (2) two bulky items or (2) two tightly secured trash bags with small household items NEXT to your trash cart or can for weekly collection. Now you can get rid of up to eight bulky items during a month without having to schedule a pickup.

*Residents who only pay for bulky trash services will still need to schedule a pickup through PGC311.



Allows you to dispose of (4) four scrap tires and (4) four white goods/appliances EACH time, but you have to schedule collection via PGC311.

*includes washing machines and dryers, refrigerators, freezers, stoves



Disposing of bulky items on a regular trash day should reduce the temptation for residents to illegally dump old couches, mattresses, and other trash along our roadways. Be Prince George's Proud and dispose of bulky items and trash the right way.



Before placing the bulky item at the curb, ask yourself if someone could use the item. Consider donating your gently used items to one of the many non-profits, groups, or organizations that accept donations before you throw it out.

According to a news release, residents who have their trash picked up from a county-provided trash service can set out two bulky items or two trash bags with small household items each week, alongside their regular trash pickup.



Update:

I just got off the phone with PG County 311 (Bulky Trash Pickup). They confirmed that "Yes", bulky trash pickup is happening on trash day (2) acceptable items max set next to the "trash" container).

I followed all those instructions, but my old CRT TV wasn't picked up. The woman I spoke with mentioned that the bulky trash people are in different trucks and make multiple runs in a day. She said to give them until 8:00 PM to make the pickup.

I mentioned that my trash and recycles had been picked up and I put my containers away. She said, "Oh...go put your empty trash container back out next to the TV. They won't pick up the TV if it's not next to a trash container".

I hadn't thought if it like that, but it makes sense. You wouldn't want them to make off with your lawnmower while you're fixing yourself a glass of sweet tea. (edited)

Stats So Far

- Week one (Feb15-18)- ~270 missed collections reported
- Week two (Feb21-25)- ~190 missed collections reported
- Week three (Feb 28- March 4) ~58 missed collections reported
 - All were addressed by our haulers or our internal staff REGARDLESS of whether resident did it correctly
 - Residents were educated when they made a mistake

This is a success thanks to our DoE Resource Recovery Division staffespecially our bulky staff and our inspectors, our communications team, our IT team and GIS experts; the support of our sister agencies including OIT and OCR; the partnership of our trash haulers; and the efforts of 311 operators who have served as the front line of questions and concerns.

Next Steps

- Additional Diversion through Community Education on Donation Opportunities
 - Issuing an RFI, to make sure we are aware of all opportunities in community and sharing them with residents
- Issuing Contract extension in partnership with haulers
 - Continuing to improve services provided by our haulers
- Doubling down on education
 - As we have more ability to be in person, come into spring clean-up season and have people
 with less 'zoom fatigue' we are working even harder to engage with residents to increase
 diversion, reduce littering and dumping and serve them better.

CURBSIDE BULKY TRASH COLLECTION



ACCEPTABLE ITEMS





Mattresses and box springs (must be covered in protective plastic encasement)



Hot water heaters and push lawn mowers (Remove the gas tank and drain the oil from lawnmowers)



Furniture: such as sofas, coffee tables, bed head/footboards, dressers, tables, chairs, etc.

Carpet and padding (Limit of carpet and padding is 324 sq. ft. - rolled and tied on ends)



Two (2) large bags of smaller household items*



*No more than two (2) large bags of smaller household items such as knick-knacks, home décor, small kitchen appliances (i.e., toaster ovens, toasters, blenders, air fryers, crock pots) can be set out instead of two regular bulky items. The two (2) large bags count as the two (2) maximum bulky items that can be set out on trash collection day.

A Vision for Residential Waste Collection in Post-Pandemic Prince George's County













Did you know Prince George's County has five curbside waste collection services under its Clear the Curb collection programs that modernize and streamline services to the more than 175,000 households? For residents receiving County services, these programs include regular trash, recycling, and yard trim collection, along with expansion of countywide food scraps composting and the new, improved bulky trash collections!

MONDAY COLLECTIONS



FOOD SCRAPS COMPOSTING

County residents can now opt in to curbside composting by February 20, 2022. Food and food-soiled items will be collected and composted with yard trim items on Mondays to produce a nutrient-rich soil amendment product called Leafgro Gold®. Participants receive a green, wheeled toter to collect their yard trim and food scraps and a countertop kitchen container to keep food scraps separate. *NO plastic bags* Join the Food Scraps Curbside Collection Program and learn more at mypgc.us/compost.



YARD TRIM COLLECTION

Yard trim is collected year-round on Monday only and includes grass clippings, leaves, small branches, brush, Christmas trees, and now, food scraps. Place yard trim in paper bags or a personal container marked for collection. If you sign up for the new Curbside Food Scraps Collection, you'll be able to add yard trim to your food scraps container. *NO plastic bags*



BULKY TRASH

Starting February 14, if you receive County trash and recycling services, you can now put up to two (2) bulky items or two (2) bags of smaller household items, tightly secured at the curb NEXT to your trash container, with no appointment needed! Some items, such as refrigerators, air conditioners and tires will still need to be scheduled through PGC311. This new and improved way of handling bulky trash will cut down on wait times and eliminate the temptation to dump illegally.

YOUR REGULAR COLLECTION DAY



REGULAR TRASH

Weekly regular trash collection is provided to residential single-family homes and townhomes, eligible to receive County-contracted services. Trash is collected curbside between the hours of 6 a.m. to 8 p.m.



RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING


Weekly single-stream residential collection allows residents to place all of their acceptable recycling materials loosely in one container without having to sort or separate. It's that easy! When you recycle more, you trash less, helping to keep valuable items out of the Landfill, reduce gashouse emissions and protect the environment.

Other self-service and drop-off residential waste services, and commercial/business collection programs offered by the County include:

ORGANICS PROGRAM

- Prince George's County owns, manages, and operates the most advanced composting facility on the East Coast.
 - The County made an investment in the GORE® technology and has 12 permanent bunkers and 8 mobile heaps, in order to accept and process food scraps and food waste into a new product made exclusively in Prince George's County called Leafgro® GOLD.
 - Leafgro® GOLD is a 100% organic, rich in nutrients, soil amendment produced by composting a mixture of grass clippings, food scraps, and leaves diverted from the landfill.
 - Diverting food scraps to the County's Organics Composting Facility reduces landfill methane gas



KITCHEN SCRAPS & MORE PROGRAM

- Households who have Opted-In by February 20 will receive collection carts beginning April 2022, in celebration of Earth Month
- Receive a 32-gallon wheeled collection cart, kitchen pail, a magnet listing acceptable food items, and a fact sheet on how to dispose of kitchen scraps.
- Information coming soon on opportunities after Feb. 20.
