In no circumstance may the use of physical force be more than that which is 3 necessary to achieve a lawful purpose. Officers are permitted to use deadly force only when the 4 officer reasonably believes that the use of deadly force is necessary in the defense of human life, 5 including the officer's own life, or in the defense of any person in immediate danger of serious 6 physical injury.] 7 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby 8 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, 9 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of 10 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this 11 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such 12 13 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, 14 or section.
