EXPLANATION OF ADJUSTMENTS

Circuit Court

The Maryland Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth and Victim Services awarded \$89,702 for the Improving Strategies and Access to Mental Health Services for Law Enforcement project. Funding will improve strategies and access to mental health services for law enforcement which includes support services, counseling services, crisis counseling, stress management counseling, resiliency sessions and suicide prevention training for police officers.

Office of the State's Attorney

The Governor's Office of Crime Prevention Youth and Victim Services awarded \$822,780 for the Victim Advocacy program. Funding provides assistance in developing and implementing strategies specifically intended to aide domestic violence victims in the County. The program focuses on providing Supportive Assistance and Financial Empowerment (SAFE) solutions for victims. Victims will be linked to supportive resources including clinical services, preparation for testimony and be advised of their rights and potential outcomes of cases being prosecuted. Funding supports salary and operating expenses. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$283,680 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The U.S. Department of Justice, Edward Byrne Justice Assistance Program through the Governor's Office of Crime Prevention Youth and Victim Services awarded \$100,000 for the Gun Violence Reduction Program II. Funding will support compensation for a prosecutor assigned to the Guns and Drugs Unit. The program also supports the "Our Streets, Our Future" initiative launched as a best practice module designed to address gun violence through a collaborative problem-solving approach to prevention, intervention and prosecution model. Funding supports personnel, equipment and training expenses.

Police Department

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded \$579,684 for the Tactical Equipment for Law Enforcement Project - UASI (FY 2021). Funding supports the purchase of equipment. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of

\$479,684 is needed to fully expend the award received.

Department of Corrections

The Edward Byrne, Justice Assistance Program through the Maryland Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth and Victim Services awarded \$83,128 for the Employee Wellness Program. Funding provides increased individual group therapy, critical incident stress debriefing, which reduces workplace injuries that affect manpower and efficient operations. The program funds will support operating expenses, contractual services and equipment for the Employee Wellness and Critical Incident Stress Management Program.

Fire/EMS Department

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security awarded \$2,648,986 for the BioWatch Program. Funding supports the intelligence-based medical and biodefense architecture program to help protect the health and medical security of the homeland through the development of a nationwide system conducting surveillance for aerosolized exposures caused by the intentional release of biological agents. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$499,586 is needed to fully expend the award received.

Department of Family Services

The U.S. Department of Treasury American Rescue Plan (ARP), through the Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$2,959,283 for the ARP of the Older Americans Act Title III programs. Funding will provide supportive services to Title IIIB: Administration, Title IIIC-1: Congregate Meals, Title IIIC-2 Home Delivered Meals, Title IIID: Preventive Health and Title IIIE: Family Caregivers.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services awarded \$786,775 for the Alzheimer's Disease Program. Funding will help enhance the quality of life for people affected by dementia in the County.

Health Department

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$59,973 for the American Rescue Plan One-Time Supplemental Funding program. Funding will support compensation and fringe benefits for the Local Overdose Fatality Review Team.

The Maryland Department of Health through the American Recuse Plan Act awarded \$298,620 for the 988 Call Center. Funding will enhance call, chat and text capability of the jurisdictions designated lifeline providers due to the transition of the National Suicide Hotline to 988 and anticipated volume projections.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$965,508 for the Sexually Transmitted Disease (STD) Caseworker grant. Funding supports the goal to reduce the transmission and complications of sexually transmitted infections through partner services, case management, treatment, surveillance and linkage to care. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$772,808 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$232,500 for the Ending the HIV Epidemic - HIV Prevention Services in STD Clinics. Funding will enhance integrated reproductive health clinic capacity which includes sexually transmitted infections (STIs), Reproductive Health, and Healthy Teens to serve areas/zip codes of the county with high HIV/STI prevalence. Programming supports expanded services for sexual health with a focus on young men who have sex with men (MSM), and young female lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGTBQ) and cisgender males and females.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$1,755,714 for the Community Mental Health program. Funding supports the County Crisis Response System, psychogeriatric nursing services and services in assisted living-homes. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$43,500 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$580,300 for the Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention program. Funding supports the prevention of child exposure to lead and educates families on the resulting adverse effects of lead exposure to growth and development. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$151,730 is needed to fully expend the award received.

Department of Social Services

The Maryland Department of Human Services awarded \$220,810 for the Low Income Household Water Assistance Program. Funding will assist low-income families with water and wastewater bills in response to COVID-19. Benefits will be distributed directly to the utility company. Funding will support compensation, fringe benefits and contractual services.

Department of Public Works and Transportation

The U.S. Department of Treasury American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), through the Maryland Department of Transportation awarded \$17,613,199 for the 5307 Urbanized Area program. Funding will support compensation and the operations of the public transit system related to the prevention, preparation for and response to COVID-19.

The Maryland Department of Transportation awarded \$10,909 for the Be Seen, Be Alert, Be Safe – A Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Campaign. Funding will support the purchase of 600 bicycle helmets, 1,000 bike lights, 500 pedestrian lights and two pop-up banners for bike safety education and outreach.

The Maryland Department of Transportation awarded \$19,500 for the Lives Shatter on Impact Wall - Street Smart Displays project. Funding will support the safe use of roadways education, through the Vision Zero Prince George's Initiative to drivers, pedestrians and bicyclists. This project communicates how distractions remain a major roadway safety concern and the impact of preventable crashes.

The U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Transit Administration awarded \$5,150,000 for the Low/No Emission Vehicle Deployment Program. Funding supports the purchase of six

battery electric buses (with training aids), four 120kw charging stations, two pantograph fast chargers and streamlined project delivery. The Department will utilize the Proterra manufacturer to provide infrastructure development to include site feasibility, design and construction. This program will allow the Department to meet a goal of fifty percent fleet electrification by 2030. A County match is required for this program in the amount of \$936,119.

The Maryland Department of Transportation awarded \$80,625 for the Maryland Bikeways program. Funding supports the purchase of fifty two-position racks to be installed on paratransit vehicles. Paratransit vehicles will be deployed for on-demand service and low ridership routes including service near parks, trails, recreational areas, bike lanes and bikeshare stations at the National Harbor and Fort Washington and surrounding vicinity. A County match is required for this program in the amount of \$26,875.

The Maryland Department of Transportation and Maryland Transit Administration awarded \$10,401,214 for the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriation Act (CRRSAA) grant. Funding will support preventing, preparing for, and responding to the coronavirus pandemic. Eligible operating expenses include driver salaries, fuel and items having a useful life of less than one year, including personal protective equipment and cleaning supplies.

The Maryland Department of Transportation awarded \$332,819 for the Statewide Specialized Transportation Assistance Program (SSTAP). Funding is utilized to replace aging para-transit vehicles. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$19 is needed to fully expend the award received. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$54,049 for the County match is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of the Environment, FY 2021 Environmental Mitigation Trust -Electric Buses program requires a County contribution in the amount of \$3,524,883. Funding will support the purchase of eight electric buses to replace eight diesel powered buses and install the required charging infrastructure. The Maryland Department of the Environment, FY 2021 Environmental Mitigation Trust – Propane program requires a County contribution in the amount of \$140,800. Funding will support the purchase of six propane powered trucks to replace six diesel powered trucks.

Department of Housing and Community Development

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, American Rescue Plan Act awarded \$7,592,085 for the HOME Investment Partnerships program. Funding supports housing services and shelter to individuals experiencing homelessness and other vulnerable populations.

The U.S. Department of Treasury through the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development awarded \$20,467,846 for the Emergency Rental Assistance Program. The program provides direct financial assistance and housing stability services to renters who are struggling to make payments for their rent and utilities due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
