10	SECTION 2. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
11	Maryland, that Section 26-127.05 of the Prince George's County Code be and is hereby added:

14	DIVISION 8 PARKING REGULATIONS.
15	Sec. 26-127.05. Reserved parking for charging electric vehicles.
16	(a) No person shall stand or park a vehicle in any stall or parking space on public or
17	private property which is designated for charging an electric vehicle with the proper signs posted
18	in conformance with the most recent edition of the State of Maryland Manual on Uniform Traffic
19	Control Devices for Streets and Highways, unless said vehicle is connected for electric charging
20	purposes.
21	(b) Any person issued a citation for a violation of this Section shall be subject to a fine of
22	One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each violation.
23	(c) The provisions of Section 26-163.01 shall not be subject to the penalty imposed under
24	this Section.
25	SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby
26	declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,
27	sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of
28	competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining
29	words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this
30	Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such
31	invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,

2	SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)
3	calendar days after it becomes law.
