1	(a) The County Executive shall provide mandatory biennial data collection and reporting of the
2	County workforce on the EEO-4 Form, being the data report, to the Equal Employment
3	Opportunities Commission.
4	(b) The data report shall consist of County workforce data by race, ethnicity, sex, job category,
5	and salary band.
6	(c) The County Executive shall submit, to the extent permitted under Federal law, the County
7	workforce data report to the County Council and the State Legislative Delegations, within ninety
8	(90) days after the data report is available.
9	(d) The data report shall be made available, to the extent permitted under Federal law, to the public
10	electronically and by hard copy, upon request, within ninety (90) days after the data report is
11	available.
12	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby
13	declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,
14	sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of
15	competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words,
16	phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since
17	the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or
18	unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.
19	SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)
20	calendar days after it becomes law.
