The Prince George's County Council convened as the Committee of the Whole on October 11, 2022, to consider appointments to The Administrative Charging Committee (ACC). As a result of legislation at the state level, the County enacted CB-021-2022 an Act Concerning Law Enforcement Accountability which established the framework for the ACC.

The Administrative Charging Committee is to be a five (5) member committee led by the Chair of the PAB, or their designee. The ACC is charged with reviewing findings from agency investigations to determine if an officer should be charged and recommend discipline to the Chief who supervises the charged officer that would align with the Maryland Police Training and Standards

Commission (MPTSC) disciplinary matrix.
