[, and minority business enterprise firms.] The property owner shall agree to spend at least 35% of total costs incurred on the energy efficiency and clean energy improvements on contracts with (i) County-based minority business enterprises and (ii) Locally-owned and Operated Businesses, which are County-based businesses that are also County-resident owned businesses, as those terms are defined in Subtitle 10A of the Code. The property owner shall also submit a Local Spending Plan to the program manager for approval, subject to the satisfaction of the program manager. The Local Spending Plan shall demonstrate the manner in which the property owner will satisfy its commitment to meet the spending requirement [goal] set forth in this paragraph.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the words and provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, subparagraph, subsection, or section.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
