### BACKGROUND

Community Colleges are authorized under the [Education](#) article of the Annotated Code of Maryland and are governed by the [Maryland Higher Education Commission](#). Prince George's Community College was established in 1958. The College operated out of the Suitland HS for the first 10 years.

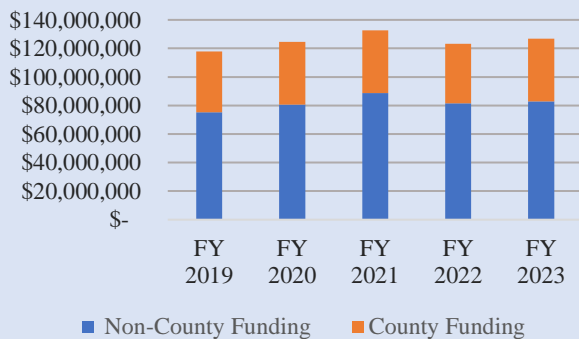
PGCC is guided by a 9-member [Board of Trustees](#) and the College President. 8 Board members are [appointed](#) by the Governor with Senate advice and a student member is elected by the College student body.

The [PGCC Foundation](#) provides scholarships and philanthropic support to the College.

The College operates 1 main campus and 5 [regional centers](#) (including one in Andrews AFB) and eLearning opportunities.

County funding accounts for about 33% of the Community College's budget, with the State providing the second largest contribution.
