




Prince George's County American Job Center Community Network Data by Year





Rapid Re-Employment **Grant Initiative**

Employ Prince George's Rapid Re-Employment Grant Initiative provides grants to businesses who hire unemployed Prince George's County residents.

Grants supplemented 50% - 75% of a new employee's salary for up to 12 weeks.

Businesses can receive a maximum of \$15,000 per new employee.



Due to the COVID-19, thousands of Prince George's County businesses have closed and over 100,000 Prince George's County residents have become unemployed. Employ Prince George's (EPG) has established the COVID-19 Workforce Development Recovery Program Rapid Re-Employment Grants to help businesses reopen and build their capacity.

What are Rapid Re-Employment Grants?

The COVID-19 Workforce Development Recovery Program was designed to prepare and connect laid off Prince George's County residents to employment opportunities, while simultaneously helping businesses reopen and rehire employees. Employ Prince George's understands that businesses are reopening, but revenues haven't reached pre-pandemic levels and many businesses are facing large financial deficits. To ease the financial burden of onboarding new employees, Employ Prince George's is offering Rapid Re-Employment Grants to local businesses. Employ Prince George's Rapid Re-Employment Grants provide funding to businesses that hire Prince George's County residents and supplement 50%-90% of their new hires salary. Grants are provided on the first day of a new employees first day of work and the maximum grant is \$50,000 per business.






