tailored to the needs and resources in Prince George's County, Maryland in conjunction with aid		
from The Greater Washington Community Foundation.		
WHEREAS	, generational poverty is defined as the condition of an individual that, during	
childhood, was supported by a family at or below the national poverty level and continues to live		
at or below the national poverty level as an adult (Urban Ventures, 2020); and		
WHEREAS	, residents of Prince George's County are intractably trapped in this	
generational cycle with little to no prospects for economic mobility; and		
WHEREAS	, generational poverty is a nationwide reality that many jurisdictions are	
combatting with a Guaranteed Income pilot, a monthly cash stipend paid directly to residents for		
a limited period o	f time, with no repayment requirement; and	
WHEREAS	, cash transfers have been studied for many years and prove to be an effective	
tool in building ed	conomic stability by diminishing continued poverty; and	
WHEREAS	, Stockton, California created the most well-known, studied, and modeled pilot	
known as the Stoo	ckton Economic Empowerment Demonstration (SEED) in 2019 and continues	
to provide monthly cash stipends to 125 randomly selected residents over a 24-month period; and		
WHEREAS	, Prince George's County in conjunction with the Greater Washington	
Community Foundation will launch a similar pilot modeled after SEED for the purpose of		

closing the racial wealth gap that feeds on generational poverty; and

WHEREAS, the Greater Washington Community Foundation will commit \$1,000,000 (One Million Dollars) to seed the pilot; and

WHEREAS, the Greater Washington Community Foundation also secured an additional \$1,000,000 (One Million Dollar) commitment from a local foundation, on the condition that Prince George's County contribute funds; and

WHEREAS, the initial 24-month pilot will require \$4,000,000 (Four Million Dollars) from a combination of fund sources to include, but not limited to: The Greater Washington Community Foundation, Prince George's County, a local foundation, and other philanthropic partners; and

WHEREAS, the Guaranteed Basic Income Pilot could significantly improve the lives of Prince George's County residents who live at or below the poverty line; and

WHEREAS, funding for the Guaranteed Basic Income Pilot program will improve the County's response to generational poverty.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Guaranteed Basic Income Pilot shall be created and seeded by the initial \$1,000,000 (One Million Dollar) contribution from the Greater Washington Community Foundation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Prince George's County Council is committed to providing up to \$2,000,000 (Two Million Dollars) needed to fund to the Guaranteed Basic Income Pilot to be used for startup costs associated with creating the Pilot, staffing, and payments to residents; and

BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Social Services shall serve as fiduciary agent for the program; and

BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED that there shall be a Committee comprised of one (1) member from each of the following entities: Prince George's County Council, Department of Social Services, The Guaranteed Basic Income Coalition of Prince George's County, and the Greater Washington Community Foundation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Committee shall be authorized to create and manage the Guaranteed Basic Income Program Pilot, modeled after SEED and tailored to the needs and resources available to Prince George's County; and

1	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Committee shall provide the Prince George's	
2	County Council progress reports on an annual basis.
