2	(Beginning of designation)
3	MR. CHAIR: We will now move onto Item 6, our
4	final item. This is DSP-21001 Suffrage Point. We have
5	received Commissioners, we have received multiple
6	requests to continue this item for a week. There are no
7	legal issues or deficiencies which would require the
8	Planning Board to continue the hearing of this matter, but
9	the Applicant has indicated that they're not opposed to a
10	continuance for a period of a week.
11	I just wanted to respond to a couple of items of
12	note on the continuance request, if I may. One, the Staff
13	report for this matter was published on December 22nd, which
14	is no less than two weeks prior to today's scheduled public
15	hearing. I just want to be clear that Staff has done their
16	job in terms of the publishing of the Staff report.
17	There was some other questions and concerns from
18	folks in the community related to the submission of large
19	files. Interested parties may submit large files by
20	contacting the Planning Department. Staff will has and
21	will continue to work with parties to coordinate the receipt
22	of those large files, as it has done in the past for other
23	matters. I'm saying this to say that that would not be a
24	reason for this continuance, because Staff has and will
25	continue to provide that kind of support.

There's no legal obligation to do so in advance to the hearing. All essential case related matters are published to the Planning Board's website, and the backup for each hearing, so things are being done by the book, as I'm repeating.

The Applicant, again, is not in opposition to the continuance -- we will hear from the Applicant -- but that is my understanding.

9 Now there are several individuals who signed up -in addition to being in opposition, there's several 10 11 individuals who signed up in favor of the project as well. 12 So I just want to acknowledge them, because they also took 13 time out to be here, and to be able to -- and to want to 14 testify as well. So if we do approve this continuance, it 15 impacts folks on both sides, and that's okay, that's 16 appropriate. I still -- as long as everyone's in agreement 17 with this, I would still support the continuance, but I just 18 want to note that it impacts folks in all sorts of ways.

19 So let me -- before I look for a motion for the 20 Board for the continuance, let me actually turn it over to 21 Staff, and then we'll hear from the applicants as well.

22 So Ms. Kosack, do you want to take it away, for a 23 bit and lay out what's before us related to the continuance? 24 MS. KOSACK: Yes. The Item Number 6, DSP-21001, 25 Suffrage Point, the -- it was scheduled for today. I

believe the City of Hyattsville was requesting a postponement of the hearing until next week, January 12th. Staff has no opposition to that postponement, and that would be still within the 70-day action limit of the case. Again, you know, Staff is not requiring that postponement, but there's no opposition to that.

7 MR. CHAIR: Thank you, Ms. Kosack. Commissioners, any questions for Staff? 8 9 COMMISSIONER DOERNER: If we're going to have -- if we're going to have another week to work on this, Ms. 10 11 Kosack, some of my questions that I can tee up for you, so 12 you have time to actually go and do them now, there's one 13 mention in the report about -- there weren't really many 14 trees that needed to be preserved, because that's -- it's a 15 parking lot right there. But my understanding is that part 16 of this application involves the lower lots, or the lower 17 parcels that are going to be dedicated to the City. I don't 18 know if any trees were cut down on those lots, which would be useful to know about if you can find out. 19

And then there's some mention in the opposition exhibits and letters about cutting down trees prematurely, and I understand that this development is the lower half of the greater development that Werrlein is doing. However, the upper half -- there was trees that were removed earlier on, and there was sediment that ran down into that lower lot

and other areas, because I bike ride through there, and I go through there, and I saw it. I would like to know a little bit more about how many trees were removed, and if they're being replanted. Particularly, because I believe -- I could be wrong on timing, but I believe they were actually removed prior to us hearing, so it was almost too late for us to do anything.

So I want to know about any complaints that were 8 9 lodged at DPIE and how those were resolved and addressed. Because, to me, one of the aspects of the DSP is to be able 10 to establish that any kind of, like, environmental arms or 11 12 any sort of changes have been remedied and has been brought 13 whole basically for this development. And I think that 14 might be missed if we just say that there were no existing 15 trees if we only look at the one part of this application, 16 because it was almost like too late to do anything in the 17 prior one. And since they split these parcels up, they are 18 separate cases, potentially, but there -- it's part of the 19 greater development that was brought forward here. So I 20 would like to hear more information about those aspects, if 21 you could prepare those.

And I also want to know, if you could work with Mr. Rivera later on, just about the timing. I know that he's proffering an MOU with the City of Hyattsville, which isn't necessarily a requirement for those parcels. But I

want to know about the timing of any kind of impact on 1 2 Parcels C and D that are being given to Hyattsville, to 3 making sure that there is stormwater management and 4 mitigations that are being put in place. That those are 5 happening early on, or just sort of like when they are. So 6 I just want to know a little bit more about the details of 7 how those will work. And I don't know if that's been established yet. 8 9 MR. CHAIR: Thank you, Commissioner Doerner. 10 MS. KOSACK: Okay, noted. I'll see what I can find out, before next weekend. 11 12 COMMISSIONER GERALDO: And Ms. Kosack, do you have 13 any more information in terms of why the -- other than why 14 they -- DPIE waived the stormwater management? Other than 15 they're going to use fill? 16 MS. KOSACK: Do you mean stormwater management, or 17 the floodplain waiver? 18 COMMISSIONER GERALDO: Floodplain. That's what I 19 meant, I'm sorry, I misspoke. 20 MS. KOSACK: Okay. 21 COMMISSIONER GERALDO: The floodplain. 22 MS. KOSACK: I don't know those details off the top of my head, but that's another thing I could look 23 24 into --25 COMMISSIONER GERALDO: Okay.

1 MS. KOSACK: -- before next week. 2 COMMISSIONER GERALDO: Thank you. 3 MS. KOSACK: Yep. 4 COMMISSIONER GERALDO: Thank you, Ms. Kosack. 5 MR. CHAIR: Ms. Coleman, you -- do you have a 6 comment, Ms. Coleman? MS. COLEMAN: I just wanted to make sure, we 7 didn't really get into the merits of the case. But just, 8 9 you know, we put forth some questions that we would like to see answered. That's fine, but as long as we're not getting 10 11 into the merits when we're talking about the continuance. 12 MR. CHAIR: Thank you, Ms. Coleman, for that 13 course correction, and I agree with you. 14 So for Staff, you have a few items that we want 15 flagged, but again, what's before us is the continuance. 16 And is there -- let me turn to Mr. Rivera, who is 17 representing the Applicant. 18 And again, just speaking directly to the 19 continuance request, Mr. Rivera. Happy New Year, by the 20 way. 21 MR. RIVERA: Happy New Year, everybody. 22 Good morning, Mr. Chairman, members of the Board. Happy Holidays. Hope everything goes well for all of us. 23 24 And we're going to miss you Ms. Butler. So good 25 luck in all your future endeavors, as Traci said.

1 As you stated, Mr. Chairman, very succinctly, 2 there is no legal reason, or technical reason, or procedural 3 reason to continue the case. We are going to agree with the 4 one week continuance, although we were fully prepared to go 5 forward today. We're happy to report that we would agree 6 with whatever the conditions. But as to the continuance, we 7 are in agreement, so that the citizens and the City can have more time to review it. I realize it was over the holidays, 8 9 but it was a timely issue as you said. So we will concur with that request to next Thursday. Thank you very much. 10 11 MR. CHAIR: Thank you, Mr. Rivera. 12 Commissioners, any questions for the Applicant 13 related to the continuance? 14 Seeing none, then I would look for a motion from 15 the Board. 16 COMMISSIONER WASHINGTON: Mr. Chairman, I move 17 that we continue DSP-21001 to Planning Board hearing date of 18 February 2nd, 2000 -- I'm sorry, January 12th, 2023. 19 MR. CHAIR: Well that got folks attention. 20 COMMISSIONER DOERNER: I second that. MR. CHAIR: We have a motion. And is there a 21 22 second? Commissioner Doerner, you seconded? 23 24 COMMISSIONER DOERNER: Yeah, I'll second. 25 MR. CHAIR: So we have a motion and a second.

1 Motion by Commissioner Washington, second by Commissioner 2 Doerner. Is there any discussion on the motion? Seeing 3 none, I'll call the roll. 4 Commissioner Washington? 5 COMMISSIONER WASHINGTON: Vote aye. MR. CHAIR: Commissioner Doerner? 6 7 COMMISSIONER DOERNER: Vote aye. MR. CHAIR: Vice Chair Bailey? 8 9 MADAM VICE CHAIR BAILEY: Vote aye. 10 MR. CHAIR: Commissioner Geraldo? 11 COMMISSIONER GERALDO: Vote aye. 12 MR. CHAIR: I vote aye as well. The ayes have it 13 5-0 for the continuance. And just to note, so the hearing 14 is being continued to January 12th, 2023. And pursuant to Planning Board rules, there is no further notice required. 15 16 So yes, but this will be on January 12th. 17 Hold on one second for me, Staff, Commissioners. 18 As part -- thank you. Staff is reminding me to 19 let folks in the community -- the public know that in 20 addition to no further notice being required, anything that you have already submitted does not need to be resubmitted, 21 22 because that will all be a part of the record, so. And Ms. Wolf, thank you for sharing your cat with 23 24 us, I appreciate that. 25 MS. WOLF: You're always welcome.

MR. CHAIR: All right. Is there anything else related to this matter? No. Thank you all very much. So that concludes all the items for today's agenda, folks. Mr. Hunt, is there any further business to come before the Planning Board today? MR. HUNT: Mr. Chairman, there are no additional business items before the Board today. MR. CHAIR: Seeing no further items, then without objection, folks, this meeting is adjourned. Thanks, everybody. Again, Happy New Year. UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Happy New Year.
