certain conditions are met; providing for the oversight for the enforcement of this Division; providing for filing certain actions; providing for a certain waiver; providing for a certain report; providing for certain citations; permitting the Department of the Environment to adopt certain regulations; providing for the applicability of this Division; and generally relating to one-time use plastic carryout bags.

Council Member Olson, Chair, Transportation, Infrastructure, Energy and Environment Committee (TIEE) provided a verbal report of the actions and recommendations of the TIEE Committee for CB-032-2023. This is the Better Bag Bill. The County Council finds that the use of single-use carryout bags by consumers at retail establishments is detrimental to the environment, public health, and welfare of County residents, and that it is in the best interests of maintaining the health, safety, and welfare of County residents and visitors to reduce the distribution of single-use carryout bags and incentivize the use of reusable bags by prohibiting provision of single-use plastic carryout bags and requiring retailers to charge at least 10 cents for each paper bag. Retail Establishment means a store, a food service facility, or any other establishment that provides bags to its customers as a result of the sale of a product, or service whether for-profit or not-for-profit. After December 31, 2023, a retail establishment may not provide a plastic carryout bag to a customer. After December 31, 2023, a retail establishment shall charge, collect, and retain at least 10 cents for each paper carryout bag and reusable carryout bag that it provides to a customer. The charge for paper carryout bags shall not apply to a paper bag containing prescription medication provided by a pharmacy to a customer. Plastic Carryout Bag means a plastic bag that is provided by a retail establishment to a customer at the point of sale and is not a reusable carryout bag. Plastic Carryout Bag does not include: a plastic bag used to: (i) package bulk items, including fruit, vegetables, nuts, grains, candy, or small hardware items; (ii) contain or wrap frozen foods, meat, or fish, whether prepackaged or not; (iii) contain or wrap flowers, potted plants, or other damp items; (iv) contain unwrapped prepared foods or bakery goods; (v) contain garments or dry-cleaned clothes; or (vi) take live fish, insects, mollusks, or crustaceans

away from the retail establishment. A retail establishment that violates the provisions of this Division is subject to a civil penalty not exceeding \$500, and the provision of one or more plastic carryout bags at a single point of sale is a single violation. The failure to charge the amount of money required under this Division for the provision of one or more paper or reusable carryout bags at a single point of sale is a single violation. A penalty may not be imposed unless a retail establishment is first issued a written notice of violation; and does not correct the violation within 7 days after receipt of the written notice.
