SECTION 1	BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
Maryland, sitting	as the District Council for that part of the Maryland-Washington Regional
District in Prince	George's County, Maryland, that Section 27-2500 of the Zoning Ordinance of
Prince George's C	ounty, Maryland, being also Subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code,
be and the same is	s repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

SUBTITLE 27. ZONING.

1	PART 27-2 INTERPRETATION AND DEFINITIONS
2	SECTION 27-2500 DEFINITIONS
3	* * * * * * * *
4	Convenience store
5	A retail sales and service store with less than 5,000 square feet of floor area that primarily sells
6	grocery or deli items and miscellaneous day-to-day goods, such as bottled drinks, candy, canned
7	foods, bread, milk, cheese, beer, wine, papers and magazines, general hardware articles, and the
8	incidental sales of tobacco or tobacco accessories not to include hookahs, provided that the area
9	of the tobacco products is not more than [sixty-four (64) square feet (8' x 8') or twenty-five
10	percent (25%)] thirty-two (32) square feet or five percent (5%) of the gross floor area, whichever
11	is less. Quick-service food may be offered as an accessory use. A convenience store may also
12	contain another principal use, such as a restaurant if such other use is also permitted in the same
13	zone. A convenience store shall not sell gas or have gas pumps.
14	* * * * * * * *
15	Gas station
16	A building or lot where gasoline or other similar fuel, stored only in underground tanks, is
17	dispensed directly to users of motor vehicles. The following activities are permitted as accessory
18	uses to a gas station:
19	(A) Sales and servicing of spark plugs, batteries, and distributors and distributor parts;
20	tune-ups;
21	(B) Tire servicing and repair, but not recapping or regrooving;
22	(C) Replacement of mufflers and tail pipes, water hoses, fan belts, brake fluid, light bulbs,
23	fuses, floor mats, windshield wipers and wiper blades, grease retainers, wheel bearings, mirrors,
24	and the like;
25	( <b>D</b> ) Washing and polishing, and sale of automotive washing and polishing materials;
26	(E) Greasing, lubrication, and radiator flushing;
27	(F) Minor servicing and repair of carburetors, fuel, oil and water pumps and lines, and
28	minor engine adjustments not involving removal of the head or crank case or racing the engine;
29	(G) Emergency wiring repairs;
30	(H) Adjusting and repairing brakes;

- (I) Retail sale of convenience items such as cold drinks, packaged foods, tobacco, prepared foods, and similar convenience goods, provided that the area of the tobacco products is not more than thirty-two (32) square feet or five percent (5%), whichever is less, of the gross floor area of the overall retail sales area;
  - (J) Retail sale of road maps and other informational material to customers;
  - (K) Provision of restroom facilities; and
- (L) Electric vehicle charging stations.

Services allowed at a gas station do not include major chassis or body work; repair of transmissions or differentials; machine shop work; straightening of body parts; or painting, welding, or other work involving noise, glare, fumes, smoke, or other characteristics to an extent greater than normally found in gas stations.

## Tobacco shop, electronic cigarette shop, or retail tobacco business

A retail store where the primary use is the retail sale of tobacco products, tobacco smoking accessories, any device or paraphernalia that can be used to deliver nicotine or other substances, including cannabis, to the person inhaling from the device, or any cartridge, component, or accessory of the device, and which may include on site consumption in accordance with Section 19-131 of the County Code and the incidental sale of food or beverage provided the gross floor area of the food or beverage area does not exceed 49 percent of the gross floor area.

Any "convenience store" or "gas station" which provides more than thirty-two (32) square feet or five percent (5%) of the gross floor area of the use for tobacco products or cannabis-use products shall also be considered a tobacco shop, electronic cigarette shop, or retail tobacco business.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Ordinance of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause,

sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.
SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Ordinance shall take effect forty-five
(45) calendar days after its adoption.
