For the purpose of	of approving a one cent increase in the additional charge for switched local	
exchange access se	ervice, commercial mobile radio service, and other 911 accessible service within	
the County.		
WHEREAS, Publ	ic Safety Article, Section 1-301, et seq., of the Annotated Code of Maryland,	
provides for the	existence and funding of a 911 System to provide timely and appropriate	
assistance when th	ne lives or property of the citizens of Maryland are in imminent danger; and	
WHEREAS,	there is currently an additional charge of one dollar and forty cents (\$1.40) per	
month applied to a	all current bills rendered for switched local exchange access service, commercial	
mobile radio servi	ce, or other 911 accessible service within the County; and	
WHEREAS, the County 911 fee was last raised, effective in FY 2024, to fully recover costs		
from the fee; and		
WHEREAS. it is the policy of the County to raise the fee annually to maintain the revenue		
necessary to fully	pay for County 911 services; and	
WHEREAS,	amendments to Section 1-311 of the Public Safety Article, Section of the	
Annotated Code of Maryland, effective October 1, 2022 authorize the County to increase the 91		
additional charge to a level necessary to cover a County's projected operational costs for the fisca		
year, to be applied to all current bills rendered for switched local exchange access service		
commercial mobil	e radio service, or other 911 accessible service within the County; and	
WHEREAS, the most recently completed audit of actual 911 expenditures in the County		

exceeded the amount of revenue from the current additional charge of one dollar and forty-cents

(\$1.40) by the rate equivalent of one cent (\$0.01), it is necessary for the County to increase the additional charge to one dollar and forty-one cents (\$1.41) for all current bills for switched local exchange access service, commercial mobile radio service, or other 911 accessible service within the County in order to fully cover the County's 911 operating expense; and

WHEREAS, proceeds from the 911 additional charge may only be used to fund the installation, enhancement, maintenance and operation of the County's 911 system; and

WHEREAS, the Public Safety Article, Section 1-311(e) of the Annotated Code of Maryland provides that the Public Service Commission shall direct each telephone company that provides service in a County that imposes an additional charge to add, within 60 days, the full amount of the additional charge to all current bills rendered for switched local exchange access service, commercial mobile radio service, or other 911 accessible service within the County; and

WHEREAS, within 60 days after a County enacts or adopts an ordinance or resolution that imposes, repeals, or modifies an additional charge, each 911 service carrier that provides service in the County shall add the full amount of the additional charge to all current bills rendered for switched local exchange access service, commercial mobile radio service, or other 911 accessible service within the County; and

WHEREAS, the County Council conducted a public hearing on April 23, 2024, pursuant to Section 1-311, prior to increasing the 911 additional charge from the charge previously adopted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the 911 additional charge of one dollar and forty-one cents (\$1.41) per month per bill for switched local exchange access service, commercial mobile radio service and other 911 accessible service in the County, be and the same is hereby approved, effective April 1, 2024.
