RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

Transitional Provisions—Extension of Time for Access to Prior Subdivision Regulations
For the purpose of approving, as a temporary measure of the governing body for Prince George's
County, an extension of the time for applications to be approved and considered under the prior
Subdivision Regulations for an additional two (2) years, from April 1, 2024, to April 1, 2026.

WHEREAS, the governing body of Prince George's County approved new, comprehensive Subdivision Regulations via enactment of Chapter 85, 2018 Laws of Prince George's County (Council Bill No. "CB-015-2018") on October 23, 2018; and

WHEREAS, during this monumental public undertaking, the Council carefully assessed, discussed, and weighed the costs and benefits associated with implementation of a wholesale replacement to the County Subdivision Regulations in open session; and

WHEREAS, during public work sessions conducted in the consideration of CB-015-2018, the Council received written and verbal comments from the public, particularly the development community, concerning the protection of viable development and land assets while transitioning to the prescriptions of the new County Subdivision Regulations; and

WHEREAS, in so doing, the Council Committee voted to approve an initial two-year transition period for access to review and approval using the prior Zoning Ordinance, which could be extended thereafter as the Council deems appropriate; and

WHEREAS, as a result, the Council approved CB-015-2018 with a two-year transition period for access to the prior Ordinance which, in order to become effective, depended on the Council's review and approval of a countywide rezoning process to implement the new and updated zoning classifications within the new Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, on July 23, 2019, the Council initiated the Countywide Map Amendment ("CMA") process via adoption of Council Resolution No. CR-027-2019, thereby approving an approval matrix, as well as goals, concepts, guidelines, and a public participation program for the process; and

WHEREAS, throughout the Council's consideration of the CMA, the Council carried forward its two-year proviso for transitional access to the prior Subdivision Regulations; and

WHEREAS, soon after the CMA process was underway, the nation was stricken by the worldwide COVID-19 pandemic which, besides compelling the Council's shift to all-virtual transaction of public business, imposed oppressive economic, workforce, and supply chain impacts nationwide, particularly in the development industry in Prince George's County; and

WHEREAS, during the public hearing processes and public work sessions concerning the CMA, the Council heard repeated calls from community stakeholders to extend the time for access to the prior Regulations to protect valuable financial investments in development projects throughout the County; and

WHEREAS, when the Council approved the CMA by way of its adoption of Council Resolution No. CR-136-2021 on November 21, 2021, the Council set April 1, 2024, as the terminal date for the two-year access period to application review and approval using the prior Subdivision Regulations, with the understanding that the Council could revisit the issue at any time prior to its expiration on April 1, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the County governing body, composed of the County Council and the County Executive, has determined that it is in the interest of the County public safety, health, and welfare to extend the time for access to review and approval of development proposals under the prior Subdivision Regulations for a period of two (2) years, being until April 1, 2026, which in turn may be extended by such subsequent legislative action of the Council; and

WHEREAS, a subdivision bill to amend the County Subdivision Regulations extending the time for access to the prior Regulations is moving through the legislative process but will not be effective prior to the current April 1, 2024, expiration date, this Resolution will temporarily extend that time until CB-027-2024 is effective; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 1017(c) County Charter, a Resolution has the force and effect of law but of a temporary or administrative character.

1	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's				
2	County, Maryland, that the time for applications filed pursuant to the prior Subdivision				
3	Regulations, as set forth in Section 24-1901 of the Prince George's County Code, be and the				
4	same is hereby EXTENDED for a period of two (2) years, expiring on April 1, 2026.				
5	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect upon approval by the				
6	County governing body.
