## **AFFECTED CODE SECTIONS:**

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT:**

The 2018 Water and Sewer Plan provides for four cycles of category change requests annually to amend the Plan. This Resolution represents the December 2023 Cycle of Amendments.

The 2018 Water and Sewer Plan was adopted by CR-64-2019, and amended by CR-75-2019, CR-11-2020, CR-45-2020, CR-87-2020, CR-98-2020, CR-22-2021, CR-49-2021, CR-87-2021, CR-105-2021, CR-017-2022, CR-063-2022, CR-097-2022, CR-014-2023 and CR-076-2023.

There are two (2) category change requests located in the Blue Plains sewer basin, three (3) in the Western Branch sewer basin, six (6) in the Piscataway sewer basin, two requesting use of interim septic systems, and three (3) in the Mattawoman sewer basin. Additionally, the Department of Permitting, Inspections and Enforcement is requesting redesignation of 25 developed residential properties to reflect the existing water and sewer service category in District 9.

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Environment Article, Title 9, Subtitle 5, of the Maryland Annotated Code, sets procedures for amendments and revisions to the Plan. At least 30 days prior to the public hearing on the amendments, the County Council must submit to the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission and The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission a copy of the resolution for their recommendations.
