




Fiscal Year 2023 Accomplishments





Agency Challenges

- The cost of completing the CBA required Classification and Compensation Study
- Discontinuation of major digital equity initiatives including lendable Chromebooks and WiFi hotspots
- Budget sustainability with all 19 branches and County Correctional Center library being opened simultaneously
- Substantial year-over-year decreases to periodicals budget while community demands titles in multiple print and electronic formats
- Sustaining Mobile Library services past federal funding set to expire in early 2027



FY 25 Budget Priorities


- Maintain Year-Round Sunday Service at Ten Branches
- Continue Highly Successful Books from Birth Program
- Dedicate additional funds to address deferred maintenance of aging facilities
- Provide merit and general wage adjustments (COLA) increases to staff according to the collective bargaining agreement and MOU with the Union



FY 25 Budget Request

PGCMLS has encountered multiple challenges and adjustments to staff levels over the past three fiscal years. These challenges resulted from the COVID-19 pandemic and the renovation/construction of multiple branch libraries. Here are some key areas that affected our staffing:

- Limited Services and Vacant Positions
- Retirements and Resignations
- Branch Construction and Renovation
- Operational Changes



Enhancement Request

- Original Budget Request to OMB did not include the cost to complete our CBA required Classification and Compensation Study
- The study will transparently document job classification as well as pay policies and practices of PGCMLS related to comparator employers
- Our last classification study was completed in 2017/2018
- The estimated cost is \$159,000
- General wage adjustment (COLA) increase that is currently in negotiations with the Union
