The Prince George's County Police Department Continuing Education Pilot Program For the purpose of encouraging the University of Maryland College Park, Bowie State University, and Prince George's Community College to work together to offer a program for Prince George's County Police Department to receive tuition and credit benefits at their respective institutions.

WHEREAS, while the University of Maryland College Park, Bowie State University, and Prince George's Community College each has its own campus police department, it does utilize the services of the Prince George's County Police Department as an adjunct force on each of their respective campuses; and

WHEREAS, this support by the Prince George's County Police Department results in a significant force multiplier which benefits the campus police departments of University of Maryland College Park, Bowie State University, and Prince George's Community College; and

WHEREAS, students living off campus outside of the jurisdiction of the campus police force, still receive the services of the Prince George's County Police Department; and

WHEREAS, tuition and credit benefits offered by the University of Maryland College Park, Bowie State University, and Prince George's Community College under a pilot program would greatly serve to assist Prince George's County in recruiting and retention of qualified police officers; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the County Council hereby supports a pilot program whereby the
