2	(1) "Education purposes" in this Section means:						
3	(A) operating or capital budget spending for the Prince George's County Public						
4	Schools (including pre-kindergarten through 12th grade)[, Prince George's County Public						
5	Schools (including pre-kindergarten through 12th grade),];						
6	(B) operating or capital budget spending for the Prince George's Community						
7	College[, and];						
8	(C) operating or capital budget spending for the Prince George's County						
9	Memorial Library System[,]; and						
10	(D) grant funds to non-profit organizations that provide educational services.						
11	including youth and young adult employment programs.						
12	(2) "Annual Local Gaming Revenue" in this Section means the total revenue that the						
13	County derives (or is projected to derive) each fiscal year from the following:						
14	(A) Local impact grants distributed to the County from video lottery terminal						
15	proceeds, excluding funds reserved for Maryland Highway 210, provided that such local impact						
16	grants are expended in the communities in immediate proximity to the video lottery facility in						
17	accordance with the procedures and requirements of state law;						
18	(B) Revenue distributed to the County from table games proceeds in accordance						
19	with state law;						
20	(C) Real property and personal property taxes;						
21	(D) Hotel and motel taxes; and						
22	(E) Admissions and amusement taxes.						
23	(3) "Youth and Young Adult Employment Programs" means programs that provide						
24	employment readiness and financial literacy training and services to young persons aged 14-24,						
25	for the purpose of ensuring they have the skills and training needed to successfully make the						
26	transition into adulthood and careers. These programs may include, but are not limited to:						
27	(A) <u>Jobs or employment,</u>						
28	(B) Apprenticeships and internships,						
29	(C) Financial literacy and education,						
30	(D) <u>Job readiness and skill training, or</u>						
31	(E) <u>Professional development</u>						

1	(4) "Support for senior citizens" means:						
2	(A) Direct financial support for County residents aged 65 and over; and						
3	(B) Financial support for nonprofit organizations that provide housing,						
4	healthcare or social services and/or programming for County residents aged 65 and over.						
5	(b) The County may exceed the maximum allocation for public education purposes set						
6	forth in subsection (a), above, by local ordinance.						
7	(c) Beginning in Fiscal Year 2018, in consultation with the local development council, the						
8	County shall annually allocate at least 25% of the Local Impact Grant, excluding funds reserved						
9	by state law for Maryland Highway 210, up to an amount not to exceed \$2,200,000 (adjusted						
10	annually for inflation), for any of the following purposes or combination thereof:						
11	(1) vocational, technical and skilled trades programs at Crossland High School to						
12	prepare county residents for successful careers in industry areas including but not limited to						
13	construction, technology, and human services; or						
14	(2) funding support for youth and young adult job employment programs.

16	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby						
17	declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph						
18	sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of						
19	competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining						
20	words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this						
21	Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such						
22	invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,						
23	or section.						
24	SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)						
25	calendar days after it becomes law.
