WHEREAS, the Prince G	George's County Office of Central Services contracted with MGT
Consulting Group to conduct a	Prince George's County Utilization and Availability Study
("County Disparity Study"), rel	eased in December of 2019, which assessed racial and ethnic
disparities between availability	and outcomes in public and private sector opportunities in Prince

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1 George's County from 2010 to 2018; and 2 WHEREAS, the County Disparity Study found more statistically significant and frequent 3 disparities in opportunity for African American Business Enterprises than any other racial 4 category of businesses in both the public and private sectors; and 5 WHEREAS, the County Disparity Study's Recommendation (H) encourages the County to partner with third parties to improve the capacity of small, minority, and women owned firms; 6 7 now therefore: 8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, 9 Maryland, that Section 10-366 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby 10 repealed and reenacted with the following amendments: SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION. 11 **DIVISION 29. PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY SMALL** 12 13 **BUSINESS CAPITAL AND GROWTH** 14 STIMULUS PROGRAM 15 Sec. 10-366. Prince George's County Small Business Capital and Growth Stimulus 16 Program. 17 There is a Prince George's County Small Business Capital and Growth Stimulus Program 18 consisting of the Prince George's County Small Business Capital and Growth Stimulus Fund 19 and the programs set forth under this Section. All funding set forth under this Section is limited 20 to monies appropriated in the County Budget. Total assistance from the Prince George's 21 County Small Business Capital and Growth Stimulus Fund in any fiscal year for a business 22 shall not exceed \$250,000 and any award is a non-renewable award. 23 (a) Definitions. 24 (1) Locally-Owned and Operated Business, in this Division, shall have the same 25 meaning as defined in Section 10A-101(a)(24.1) of this Code. 26 (2) Local Start-Up Business in this Subtitle means a business based in Prince George's 27 County and in operation for 36 months or less. 28 (3) African American Business Enterprise ("AABE"), in this Subtitle, shall have the 29 same meaning as defined in Section 10A-101(a)(1) of this Code. 30 (b) [(a)]Prince George's County Business Expansion and Start-Up Grant Program. 31 (1) The Prince George's County Business Expansion and Start-Up Grant Program is

1	hereby established as a program in which the County shall annually award grant	ts
2	to Locally Owned and Operated Businesses for the purposes of the following

25	that shall be reserved for such priority industry sectors. At a minimum, the

9	(A) The County Council and County Executive may request an annual report to

19	(A) Locally-Owned and Operated Business, in this Subtitle, means a County-
20	based business that is also a County resident-owned business as defined in
21	Subtitle 10A of the Code.
22	(B) Local Start-Up Business in this Subtitle means a business based in Prince
23	George's County and in operation for 36 months or less.]
24	(c) [(b)]Prince George's County Business Expansion and Start-Up Loan Program.
25	(1) The Prince George's County Business Expansion and Start-Up Loan Program is
26	hereby established as a program in which the County shall annually award no-
27	interest loans to Locally-Owned and Operated Businesses for the purposes of the
28	following activities occurring in Prince George's County:
29	(A) Business expansion, business capacity-building, and business retention;
30	(B) Job creation and job retention; and
31	(C) Business start-ups and early-stage business growth.

1	(2) [At least 30% of the annual awards from the Prince George's County Business
2	Expansion and Start-Up Loan Program shall be reserved for Local Start-Up
3	Businesses.]
4	Allocation of the annual awards.
5	(A) Awards from the Prince George's County Business Expansion and Start-
6	Up Loan Program shall be distributed annually as follows:
7	i. 30% reserved for Local Start-Up Businesses; and
8	ii. 20% for business that are located within the beltway as described
9	in subsection (6)(A) below; and
10	iii. 50% for all other applications subject to subsection (6).
11	(B) Should a business qualify for an award under multiple categories among i-
12	iii above, then the award allocated shall only be counted under one (1)
13	category for purposes of calculating distribution percentages of annual
14	award allocation.
15	(3) The maximum annual loan award from this program shall be \$250,000.
16	(4) Loan repayment shall include zero percent (0%) interest and a twelve (12) month
17	deferment between the remittance of the loan funds to the business and the date of
18	the first repayment.
19	(5) Any recipient of a loan award under this Subsection shall:
20	(A) be a registered business in good standing with the State of Maryland and
21	County; and
22	(B) Remain a County-based business for at least the next sixty (60) months of the
23	business's existence after receipt of the loan, as a written condition of accepting
24	the loan.
25	(6) Priority Industry Sectors. The County Council, by resolution, with the concurrence
26	of the County Executive, may establish priority industry sectors for awards from
27	this Program, including the proportion of the annual awards that shall be reserved
28	for such priority industry sectors. At a minimum, the priority sectors will include
29	businesses:
30	(A) located within the beltway (the area in the County between the border with
31	the District of Columbia and the Capital Beltway); or

1	(B) within one-quarter mile of a transit station; or
2	(C) within one of the primary or secondary growth sectors outlined in the
3	Approved Economic Development Strategic Action Plan for Prince George's
4	County.
5	(7) <u>Annual Report.</u>
6	(A) The County Council and County Executive may request an annual report to
7	be provided with analysis on grant program to include at a minimum the
8	following information categorized by race and gender of each applicant:
9	i. The name of applicant; and

14	(d) [(c)] Prince George's County Technology Incentive Program
15	(1) There is a Prince George's County Technology Incentive Program, which includes
16	a Prince George's County Biosciences Supplemental Incentive Program and
17	Prince George's County New Technologies Incentive Program.

19	(e) [(d)] Prince George's County Small Business Accelerator Program.
20	(1) The Prince George's County Small Business Accelerator Program is hereby
21	established as a program in which the County shall make grant awards to foster
22	the expansion or establishment of small and minority business capacity
23	* * * * * * * *
24	(f) [(e)] Prince George's County Small Business Capital and Growth Stimulus Fund is
25	hereby established as a non-lapsing fund from which the County shall provide funding
26	for the programs authorized under this section. The Fund shall be administered in
27	accordance with Subsection (f), below.
28	(g) [(f)] Fund Management of the Prince George's County Small Business Capital and
29	Growth Stimulus Program.

31	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the County Executive and County Council

1 shall in writing reevaluate and reconsider the need of the Act to address disparities in 2 opportunities for African American Business Enterprises, with the goal of servicing at least fifty-3 percent (50%) of those qualifying businesses, within the next five (5) years or at the time of the 4 next County Disparity Study, whichever occurs earlier. 5 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby 6 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, 7 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of 8 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining 9 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this 10 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, 11 12 or section. 13 SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law. 14 Adopted this day of , 2024.
