Dear Dr. Lever:

The purpose of this joint signature letter is to endorse the Prince George's County Board of Education's proposed FY 2016 capital budget request and to identify the projects that this County considers most critical. This funding endorsement is consistent with the County's priorities to support educational programs for highly effective teaching and high student achievement.

The Board's FY 2016 funding request of \$68.8 million addresses the many needs faced by our County's schools such as replacement of current facilities, renovations, and additional elementary seats. The County supports the Board's FY 2016 funding request.
