20	Sec. 13-314. Legislative findings and declaration of purpose.		
21	The County Council for Prince George's County, Maryland, hereby f	finds that Prince	

1	George's County is facing significant issues with respect to the lack of management and		
2	oversight as it relates to Common Ownership Communities; that there is a lack of homeowner		
3	education with regard to the real estate process, governance, enforcement procedures, and		
4	resolution of disputes; that there exists a misunderstanding amongst homeowners of the		
5	responsibilities of the developer/builder as it relates to the establishment and direction of an		
6	efficiently operated homeowner association/Common Ownership Community; and that in order		
7	to effectively respond, the County Council for Prince George's County, Maryland hereby		
8	declares that it is the public policy of Prince George's County to establish a program to assist in		
9	addressing the needs of Common Ownership Communities by providing education, training and		
10	dispute mediation services through the Common Ownership Communities Program.		
11	Sec. 13-315. Common Ownership Communities Program.		
12	(a) There is hereby established a Common Ownership Communities Program. The		
13	Common Ownership Communities Program shall be administered by the Director of the Office		
14	of Community Relations.		
15	(b) Rules and regulations, consistent with the purpose and spirit of the Common		
16	Ownership Communities Program, shall be promulgated by the County Executive, subject to		
17	County Council approval by resolution. Said rules and regulations shall govern the		
18	implementation and administration of the Common Ownership Communities Program.		
19	Sec. 13-316. Definitions.		
20	As used in this Division:		
21	(a) Common Ownership Community means:		
22	(1) A condominium, as defined pursuant to state law;		
23	(2) A cooperative housing corporation, as defined pursuant to state law; or		
24	(3) A homeowners association, as defined pursuant to state law.		
25	(b) Director means the Director of the Office of Community Relations.		
26	(c) Office means the Office of Community Relations.		
27	Sec. 13-317. Director; duties and responsibilities.		
28	(a) The Director shall have operational responsibility for carrying out the duties prescribed		
29	in this Division and for enforcing the provisions of this Division.		
30	(b) The Director is authorized to:		
31	(1) research, assemble, analyze and disseminate pertinent data and educational		

1	materials about activities and programs which assist Common Ownership Communities: plan		
1	materials about activities and programs which assist Common Ownership Communities; plan		
2	and conduct educational and other programs, meetings and conferences to promote the operation		
3	of Common Ownership Communities;		
4	(2) maintain a master roster of Common Ownership Communities, their leadership,		
5	and their professional management companies if applicable;		
6	(3) develop and maintain an information, assistance and referral system for all		
7	services in the County related directly to Common Ownership Communities, and recommend		
8	other services when needed;		
9	(4) maintain a collection of Common Ownership Community association documents		
10	for use as a model and for reference;		
11	(5) develop an education program for residents in a Common Ownership Community		
12	that includes but is not limited to governance of a Common Ownership Community, rights and		
13	duties of residents in a Common Ownership Community, and dispute resolution;		
14	(6) develop an education program for Common Ownership Community governing		
15	bodies that includes but is not limited to adoption and enforcement of rules, transition from		
16	developer control, conduct of elections, and selection of community management and other		
17	professional services; and		
18	(7) operate a dispute mediation process.		
19	Sec. 13-318. Registration.		
20	(a) A Common Ownership Community shall register with the Office on or before		
21	December 31 of each year, and identify its elected leadership and managing agents, on a form		
22	provided by the Office.		
23	(b) The governing body of a homeowners' association, the council of unit owners of a		
24	condominium, and the board of directors of a cooperative housing corporation are responsible for		
25	compliance with this subsection.		
26	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)		
27	calendar days after it becomes law.
