SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,					
Maryland, that Sections 5-2617, 5-2618, 5-2619, 5-2620, 5-2621, and 5-2622 of the

DIVISION 27. CONVENIENCE STORES AND GAS STATIONS.					
Sec. 5-2617. Legislative Intent.					
(a) The purpose and intent of this legislation is to improve public safety and reduce commercial	ial				
crime by strengthening safety standards at convenience stores and gas stations. This					
legislation establishes reasonable and uniform laws to promote the health, safety, and					
welfare of the citizens and residents of the County. The provisions of this law are in					

1	response to violent crimes taking place in or in close proximity to convenience stores and			
2	gas stations throughout the County.			
3	Sec. 5-2618.	Definitions and Scope of Legislation.		
4	<u>(a)</u> The	following words, as used in this Division, shall for the purpose of this Division,		
5	<u>have</u>	the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this Section:		
6	(1)	Convenience store shall mean any food or beverage store that is open for		
7		business from 12:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. that provides retail sales of food, beverages		
8		and sundries primarily for home consumption, and may include food or beverage		
9		preparation. Convenience store does not include a Department or Variety Store		
10		that provides incidental sales of candy, gum and similar non-refrigerated items at		
11		a check-out counter, or in a standard vending machine.		
12	(2)	Gas Station shall mean a building or lot having pumps and storage tanks, where		
13		the primary use is the retail sale of motor vehicle fuels. Vehicle related services		
14		may be offered incidental to the primary use.		
15	(3)	Police Department shall mean the Prince George's County Police Department.		
16	(4)	Police Chief shall mean the Chief of the Prince George's County Police		
17		<u>Department.</u>		
18	(5)	Police Officer shall mean a sworn member of the Prince George's County Police

Notice. 9 (a) Convenience stores and gas stations shall place notice at their front entrance providing 10 that there is less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) in the cash register and that the premises is 11 under surveillance. 12 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby 13 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, 14 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of 15 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining 16 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such 17 18 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, subparagraph, subsection, or section. 19 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) 20 calendar days after it becomes law.
