15	WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council for Prince George's County, in CB-1-
16	1989, CB-98-1990, CB-30-1992, CB-129-1994, CB-53-1995, CB-29-2008, CB-65-2010, and
17	CB-68-2010, respectively, adopted a Landscape Manual for Prince George's County by
18	reference a part of the Zoning Ordinance of Prince George's County, Maryland, being also
19	Subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code; and
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WHEREAS, the Landscape Manual is a regulatory tool that requires that landscape plans submitted in association with a building and/or grading permit meet minimum requirements for development in all zones; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to amend a portion of the Landscape Manual to clarify exemption of certain projects from the prescriptions of the Landscape Manual in certain specific circumstances; now, therefore:

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, sitting as the District Council for that part of the Maryland-Washington Regional District in Prince George's County, Maryland, that Section 1.1 of the Prince George's County Landscape Manual, adopted by reference as part of the Zoning Ordinance of Prince George's County, Maryland, being also Subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code, be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

SECTION 1 – GENERAL INFORMATION AND PROCEDURES

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1.1 Applicability

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(g) In addition to permits exempt as stated in 1.1(d), the following are exempt from the requirements of Section 4.3, Parking Lot Requirements:

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(1) Permits for any <u>building</u>, building renovation, <u>or building</u> expansion [, or change of use that does not necessitate an increase in the number of parking or loading spaces beyond the number currently existing. When a building or site renovation, expansion, or change of use results in the creation of additional impervious area, the entire parking facility associated with the property shall be subject to Section 4.3.] <u>that results in a limit of disturbance as shown on any Site Plan, the Parking Lot Interior Planting requirement shall be calculated as five percent (5%) of the limit of disturbance of any existing parking compound within the boundaries of the limit <u>of disturbance.</u></u>

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(6) Properties in a commercial, industrial, or mixed-use zone subject to a Detailed Site Plan or Specific Design Plan approved before December 13, 2010, or have maintained an active grading permit since December 13, 2010.
