For the purpose	f establishing the Re-Entry Council to determine, evaluate, and assess the		
feasibility of dev	eloping a Re-Entry Program in the County to service returning citizens		
attempting to re-	nter society, and to develop a long-term three prong process that creates a Re-		
Entry Court, a or	e-stop shop for re-entry services and job placement.		
WHEREAS	, in Prince George's County, hundreds of returning citizens are released back		
into the commun	ty each day after completing their sentence at the Department of Corrections		
and/or our local	nil; and		
WHEREAS	, the recidivism rate amongst returning citizens in Prince George's County is		
high and continu	ally growing; and		
WHEREAS	, returning citizens face obstacles in the reentry process that range from getting,		
maintaining, and	advancing in a job, to overcoming other significant barriers like the need for		
substance abuse	reatment and obtaining affordable housing, in order to successfully reintegrate		
into society; and			
WHEREA	, the effective re-entry of persons transitioning from incarceration back into		
society in a man	er that fosters their positive rehabilitation and enables them to become		
productive citize	s of our County can benefit the entire community; and		
WHEREAS	, the County government has an obligation to the residents and citizens to		
implement strate	ties to address returning citizens' multiple, concurrent service needs and create		
a comprehensive	action plan to guide the County's many partners in a coordinated approach to		
meeting the varie	d needs of the returning citizens population; and		

WHEREAS, Section 506 of the Charter provides that the Council may appoint, for designated periods, one or more temporary advisory boards of citizens of the County who shall assist in the coordination of County policies and programs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Re-entry Council is hereby established in an effort to determine, evaluate, and assess the feasibility of developing a Re-Entry Program in the County; evaluate what resources will be needed to implement a Re-Entry Program; develop a Countywide plan to assist returning citizens in successfully transitioning back to the community; address the needs and engagement of employers; survey existing services; develop a model program or process for serving returning citizens; review relevant legislation; formulate the best methods to create a Re-Entry Court, and a one-stop shop for re-entry services and job placement and focus on the involvement of the faith based community.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Re-entry Council shall be composed of 19 members and Co-Chaired by representatives from the 3 branches of government:

- 1. The Chairman of the County Council or the Chairman's representative, who shall serve as Co-Chair;
- 2. The Deputy Chief Administrative Officer for Public Safety or the Deputy Chief Administrative Officer's representative, who shall serve as Co-Chair;
- 3. The Administrative Judge of the Prince George's County Circuit Court or the Administrative Judge's representative, who shall serve as Co-Chair;
- 4. The Chief of Police or the Chief's representative;
- 5. The Sheriff or the Sheriff's representative;
- 6. The Director of Corrections or the Director's representative;
- 7. The State's Attorney or the State's Attorney's representative;
- 8. The Public Defender or the Public Defender's representative;
- 9. The Health Officer or the Health Officer's representative;
- 10. The Director of Social Services or the Director's representative;
- 11. The Director of Housing and Community Development or the Director's representative;
- 12. The CEO of the Prince George's County Public Schools or the CEO's representative;
- 13. The Council's appointment to the Prince George's County School Board;

1	14. The President of the Prince George's Community College or the President's	
2	representative;	
3	15. Two (2) representatives from non-profit organizations;	
4	16. Two (2) representatives from the Faith Based Community; and	
5	17. One (1) citizen of the County selected by the Chairman of the County Council.	
6	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Re-Entry Council shall present its findings and	
7	recommendations to the County Council on or before March 31, 2014.	
8	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council Administrator shall assign appropriate	
9	technical and administrative support staff to assist the Re-Entry Council in its work.
