dispense money	in exchange for personal property and is also known as a reverse vending					
machine; and						
WHEREAS, during the 2014 Session of the Maryland General Assembly, Chapter 161 of						
the Laws of Maryland of 2014 was enacted regarding the State regulation and State licensing of						
automated purch	asing machines; and					
WHEREAS, Chapter 161 of the Laws of Maryland of 2014 is codified in the Business						
Regulation Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, Sections 20-101 through 20-502, Title						
20. Automated Purchasing Machines, and requires the designation of a primary law enforcement						
unit to provide a law enforcement contact for State regulated and State licensed automated						
purchasing machines within Prince George's County; and						
WHEREAS	S, Prince George's County prohibits the installation or operation of automated					
purchasing mach	ines within the County; and					
WHEREAS, the purpose for designating a primary law enforcement unit for automated						
purchasing machines is to comply with State law.
