EXPLANATION OF ADJUSTMENTS

Department of Social Services

The Maryland Department of Human Resources awarded \$698,127 in additional funding for the Welfare Reform-Work Opportunities. Funding supports the cost of providing employment-related assistance to clients of various benefit programs. Job development, referrals, placements, and job-seeking skills training are some of the components of this initiative, which seeks to reduce welfare dependency through employment.

The Department of Social Services was sub-granted an award through the Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services in the amount of \$348,343 in additional funding for the Affordable Care Act-Connector Program. Funding provides outreach activities to help consumers learn about, apply for and enroll in an appropriate health insurance product.

The Maryland Department of Human Resources awarded \$194,200 in additional funding for the Family Investment Administration (FIA) Temporary Administrative Support. Specifically, the funding is provided to hire additional staff to address timeliness issues relating to the processing of benefits for the Temporary Cash Assistance, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (formerly known as Food Stamps), Temporary Disability Assistance, and Medical Assistance programs.

The Maryland Department of Human Resources awarded \$12,625 in additional funding for the Office of Home Energy Programs. Funding assists low-income families in meeting the high costs of winter energy bills. Benefits are distributed to utilities, fuel suppliers, and landlords on behalf of needy families (those with incomes at or below 150% of the Federal Poverty Level).

Department of Corrections

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded \$400,000 for the Bail Reform program. The focus of this initiative is to conduct criminal background investigations on a 24 hour basis to expedite the initial bail hearing and increase the number of pretrial releases thereby reducing the number of jail commitments.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention (GOCCP) awarded \$44.00 in additional funding for the Community Services Program and \$12,986.24 is projected for "program user fees". Funding provides to develop and establish non-profit, charitable, and governmental work sites for adult, non-violent offenders who are assigned by the court to perform community service work as a condition of probation.

Office of Homeland Security

The Maryland Emergency Management Agency awarded \$38.00 in additional funding for the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG).

Circuit Court

The Office of Problem-Solving Courts awarded \$76,155 for the Re-Entry Court. Funding provides for a voluntary supervised, sanction and incentive based, eighteen month comprehensive court program. The target population consists of incarcerated individuals, with alcohol or drug related problems/dependencies, which have two or more years remaining on their sentences. Upon admission, participants receive court ordered treatment commitment under the Maryland Health General Article and enter into a two phase residential/outpatient treatment program under the Department of Corrections and Work Release Center in Prince George's County.

The Maryland Problem Solving Court Commission awarded \$26,966 in additional funding for the Adult Drug Court-Maryland Problem Solving Grant. Funding supports the operations of the Drug Court; including reimbursing salaries for legal staff and operating expenses in order to promote the full institutionalization of Drug Court programs across Maryland.

The Maryland Problem Solving Court Commission awarded \$817 in additional funding for the Juvenile Drug Court-Maryland Problem Solving Grant. Funds support direct client services, staff education, partnership expansion and other services focused on program development with an emphasis on the major role family life plays in the lives of young people experiencing substance abuse issues.

Department of Family Services

The Corporation for National and Community Service awarded \$1 in additional funding for the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP). Funding supports training and technical assistance activities to develop volunteer service opportunities in County government and with non-profit agencies for approximately 600 older county citizens (55+).

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$6,494 in additional funding for the Senior Care Program. Funding provides for coordinated, community-based, in-home services to seniors with disabilities. Senior Care provides "Gapfilling" funds for services for seniors who may be at risk of nursing home placement.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$3,368 in additional funding for the State Guardianship Program. Funding provides for case management services for individuals referred by the courts and for whom the Department's Director has been appointed legal guardian.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH) awarded \$218,133 for the Home Visiting Expansion program. Funding provides for Healthy Families Prince George's; a voluntary program that provides support to first time mothers under the age of 25 and to the children's fathers. Services include prenatal support, intensive home visiting and mentoring services. These additional funds support expanded services throughout Prince George's County.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$70 in additional funding for the Vulnerable Elderly Program which decreased the county cash contribution. Funding supports the Guardianship Program, which ensures the provision of optimum care/services for adjudicated wards of the court, through professional case management.

The Governor's Office for Children (GOC) awarded \$11 in additional funding for the Afterschool Program. Funding provides for after school enrichment programs that promote positive youth development in a structured, supervised setting. Program activities include academic enrichment in reading, math, arts, education, and a variety of sports activities.

The Governor's Office for Children (GOC) awarded \$45 in additional funding for the Community Partnership Agreement (CPA). Funding provides for administrative costs for the Division for Children, Youth and Families as well as the Local Access Mechanism.

The Maryland State Department of Education awarded \$137,200 for the Race To The Top program. Funding provides for local school readiness achievement gaps for children with high needs, including children from low-income families, children with disabilities and English language learners.

The Governor's Office for Children (GOC) awarded \$3 in additional funding for the Multi-Systemic Therapy (GOC) program. Funding provides for an intensive family and community based treatment model that addresses the multiple determinants of serious antisocial behavior in juvenile offenders. The multi-systemic approach views individuals as being nested within a complex network of interconnected systems that encompass individual, family and extra familial (peer, school, neighborhood) factors. Referrals for this funding stream are received from the courts, schools and family members.

The Department of Juvenile Services (DJS) awarded \$27 in additional funding for the Multi-Systemic Therapy (DJS) program. Funding provides for an intensive family and community based treatment model that addresses the multiple determinants of serious antisocial behavior in juvenile offenders. Referrals for this funding stream are received only from the Department of Juvenile Services.

The Governor's Office for Children (GOC) awarded \$43 in additional funding for Gang Prevention program. This program utilizes the Phoenix Gang Prevention and Intervention curriculum which is an evidence based model for students and parents in school settings. Currently, the curriculum is being implemented in Buck Lodge Middle School, and High Point and Northwestern High Schools.

The Governor's Office for Children (GOC) awarded \$10,000 for School Climate Initiative program. Funding supports local participation in the Statewide School Climate Initiative.

Health Department

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded an additional \$4,415 for the Cities Readiness Initiative. Funding will enhance the County's preparedness for a bioterrorism event. Primary objectives include interoperable communications, standardization of equipment, regional risk communication, training drills and exercises.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded \$23 in additional funding for the Mental Health Services Program. Funding provides long-range planning for mental health services, needs assessments and the development of alternative resource providers. Additionally, these funds provide for grants to the public or providers, to services targeted populations.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Behavioral Health Administration awarded \$121 in additional funding for the Federal Block Grant. Funding provides assistance to consumer who are in crisis and to elderly consumers with special needs.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded \$64,080 in additional funding for the Maryland Project LAUNCH Program. Funding is provided to support an early Childhood system of care.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Prevention and Health Promotion Administration awarded an additional \$113,888 for the Integration of Sexual Health in Recovery Program. Funding provides for a partnership between the HIV/AIDs and Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration (ADAA) to integrate a sexual health framework in the Substance Abuse Treatment Program.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration awarded \$19,112 in additional funding for the Substance Abuse Prevention Program. Funding will provide outreach services to schools and communities to prevent involvement with drugs. The target population is families of school-aged children determined to be at high risk for substance abuse.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration awarded an additional \$203,640 for the Recovery Support Service Expansion. Funding will provide housing for women with dependent children. Funding will also support service activities such as: educational/vocational counseling, recovery planning, life skills and social/recreational activities at the Adolescent Clubhouse.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded \$32,052 in additional funding for the General Medical Assistance Transportation grant. Funding provides non-emergency transportation for frail elderly individuals with chronic disease to their medical appointments.

The Geriatrics Evaluation and Review Services Program anticipates \$109,972 in additional fees collected due to the program's ability to close additional cases. Funding will provide comprehensive evaluations for aged and functionally disabled adults who need long term care and are at risk for institutionalization.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded an additional \$12 for the Maryland Children's Health Program. Funding will provide health insurance coverage to low-income pregnant women whose income is below the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) and children under the age of nineteen with family incomes below the FPL.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Prevention and Health Promotion Administration awarded \$150,000 for the Linkage To Care Program. Funding will support the implementation of link-to-care and reengagement-in-care activities in order to improve the health of persons living with HIV. Funding will also support two limited term grant funded Disease Control Specialists.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded an additional \$2,100 for the Babies Born Healthy Initiative. This initiative's focus is to improve access to perinatal services, reduce the infant mortality rate and improve pregnancy outcomes for at-risk women in the County through the provision of comprehensive women's health care.

The District of Columbia Department of Health, HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis, STD and TB Administration awarded \$304,218 in additional funding for the Ryan White Part A & MAI grant. Funding provides for diagnosis, treatment, follow-up and education for eligible HIV positive Maryland residents.

The Maryland State Department of Education, Division of Special Education/Early Intervention Services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and the Consolidation Local Implementation Grant awarded \$192,498 in additional funding to the Infants and Toddlers Program. The Infants and Toddlers Program provides families with early intervention services targeted to infants and toddlers who have a developmental delay, a diagnosed condition a (i.e. Down Syndrome, Austin, or Cerebral Palsy) or who may be at risk for development delay as a result of a high-risk condition.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded an additional \$31,080 for the Breast Feeding Peer Counseling Project. Funding will support three limited term grant funded positions and supplies to encourage women to breastfeed infants.

The United States Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) through the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded \$40,000 for the Oral Health Program. Funding is provided to improve the oral health of Maryland residents. Services will be provided via the Deamonte Driver Dental Van.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded an additional \$699,150 for the AIDS Case Management Program to provide medical case management for those infected with HIV including retaining clients in care. Medical case management provides the necessary support services to clients such as connecting them to social services, assisting with housing needs, transportation for medical appointments and emergency financial assistance to improve health outcomes.

The Department of Health and Human Services, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration awarded \$460,000 for the System of Care Expansion Planning Grant. Funding will address some of the substance abuse, behavioral health and mental health issues in the County.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded an additional \$18,254 for the Public Health Emergency Preparedness Program to provide assistance for public health emergencies strategic planning. These efforts support the National Response Framework (NRF), which guides how the nation responds to all types of hazards including infectious disease outbreaks, natural disasters, biological, chemical, and radiological incidents and explosions.

Police Department

The Maryland Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention, Byrne Justice Assistance Grant awarded \$100,000 for the Firearms Examination Equipment Project. Funding will be used to purchase microscopes for the Firearms Examination Unit.

The Maryland Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded \$53,000 for the Gun Violence Reduction Initiative – Overtime Support Program. This program assists in developing and implementing strategies specifically intended to reduce gun related crime pertaining to commercial robberies in Prince George's County, Maryland. Funding provides overtime for officers assigned to the Bureau of Patrol.

The Maryland Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded an additional \$16,507 for the Gun Offender Registry Project. This project addresses gun violence by registering and monitoring offenders convicted of gun violence in the County. Funding will support overtime to register gun offenders.

Department of the Environment

The Maryland Department of the Environment awarded \$33,200 for the Statewide Electronics Recycling Program. Funding will support efforts to recycle computers, video display devices, and other electronic goods in order to save valuable landfill capacity. The program recycles useful materials, and protects public health and the environment from the potential effects of metal and chemicals that may leach from electronics.

Department of Public Works and Transportation

The Maryland Department of Transportation, Maryland Transit Administration awarded \$500,000 for the Bus Stop Improvements Project. Funding will support Countywide bus stop improvements related to Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

The Maryland Department of Transportation, Maryland Transit Administration awarded an additional \$57 for the Statewide Specialized Transportation Assistance Program. Funding will support the replacement of aging para-transit vehicles. This grant requires a cash match in the amount of \$788 provided for by the General Fund.
