REPORT: COMMITTEE VOTE: Favorable 3-0 (Councilmember's: Campos, Davis, and Lehman

This bill will amend the County code by adding Veterans and Service Disabled Veterans to the definition of minority individuals in the County purchasing laws.

The law establishing Maryland's Procurement Preference Program for Veterans Owned Small Business (VOSB's) and Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business (SDVOSB's) was effective on October 1, 2008. This law established a percentage price preference of up to 7% for certified VOSB's and up to 8% for SDVOSB's. The VOSB and SDVOSB certification is restricted to veterans domiciled in Maryland. There is no Maryland residences requirement for owners of small business participating in the Preference as small business without the veteran-owned or disabled-veteran-owned designation.

The Office of Law has reviewed this bill and finds it to be in proper legislative form with no legal impediments to its enactment.

The enactment of CB-62-2012 will not have a negative fiscal impact on the County.

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT:
