**REPORT:** Committee Vote: **Favorable**, 3-0 (In favor: Council Members Patterson, Taveras, and Turner)

CR-10-2015 is a Resolution which will continue the benefits given to Prince George's County employees called to active duty along with their fellow service men and women as a result of the war on terrorism.

Previously, the Council adopted CR-21-2013 which provide for the benefits and it expired on March 1, 2015. As proposed the resolution provides the following benefits:

- a. Eligibility for a salary supplements equaling the difference between the employees' base county rate of pay and his/her military rate of pay, without the employees having to exhaust his/her leave and compensatory leave balance.
- b. Eligibility for continuation of health care benefits once the employee enters a leave without pay status, with the County paying both the employer and employee portions of the premium during the employees' active status.

The Office of Law finds the Resolution to be in proper form.

The Office of Human Resources Management supports the Resolution.

The Office of Audits and Investigations finds that the bill will have a fiscal impact on the County in the amount of \$13,436.76.

The Resolution only affects 5 County employees.
