19		(5) <u>The right to have all funds of the association managed in accordance with</u>
20		generally accepted fiduciary standards.
21	(b)	The rights of lot owners are as follows:
22		(1) The right of access to all books and records kept by or on behalf of the association
23		subject to State law, including records of all financial transactions.
24		(2) The right to cast a vote on any matter requiring a vote by the association's
25		membership in proportion to the lot owner's ownership interest.
26		(3) The right to have notice of any meeting of the board of directors and to participate
27		in such meeting.
28		(4) The right to have (i) notice of any proceeding conducted by the board of directors
29		or other tribunal specified in the declaration against the lot owner to enforce any
30		rule or regulation of the association and (ii) the opportunity to be heard and
31		represented by counsel at the proceeding, and the right of due process in the
32		conduct of that hearing.

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(5) The right to have all funds of the association managed in accordance with
generally accepted fiduciary standards.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
