SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,			
Maryland, that Section	on 10-309.01 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby

(a) Fifty percent (50%) of Annual Local Gaming Revenue, up to a maximum of \$25 millio			
shall be allocated fo	r public education purposes by the County in its regular or supplemental		
budget processes.			

1	(1) "Public education purposes" in this Section means operating or capital budget
2	spending for the Prince George's County Public Schools (including pre-kindergarten through
3	12 <sup>th</sup> grade), Prince George's Community College, and Prince George's County Memorial Library
4	System.
5	(2) "Annual Local Gaming Revenue" in this Section means the total revenue that the
6	County derives (or is projected to derive) each fiscal year from the following:
7	(A)Local impact grants distributed to the County from video lottery terminal
8	proceeds, excluding funds reserved for Maryland Highway 210, provided that such local impact
9	grants are expended in the communities in immediate proximity to the video lottery facility in
10	accordance with the procedures and requirements of state law;
11	(B) Revenue distributed to the County from table games proceeds in accordance with
12	state law;
13	(C) Real property and personal property taxes;
14	(D) Hotel and motel taxes; and
15	(E) Admissions and amusement taxes.
16	(b) The County may exceed the maximum allocation for public education purposes set forth
17	in subsection (a), above, by local ordinance.
18	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that Annual Local Gaming Revenue reserved
19	for public education purposes in accordance with Section 10-309.01(a) of this Act shall be used
20	to supplement, not supplant, other county general fund revenue already allocated to the Prince
21	George's County Public Schools, Prince George's Community College, and Prince George's
22	County Memorial Library System.
23	SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)
24	calendar days after it becomes law.
