RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

Local Business Participation Advisory Committee

For the purpose of establishing a Local Business Participation Advisory Committee to the County Council.

WHEREAS, Prince George's County has enacted numerous policies over the past several years to increase local business and local minority business participation in public and private sector procurement opportunities and increase local business capacity; and

WHEREAS, consistent input from our local business community is vital to the successful implementation of policies designed to encourage greater local business and local minority business participation and increase local business capacity and will help close any perceived "gaps" between the intent of such policies and their practical impact; and

WHEREAS, feedback from our local business community can assist the County Council and the County Executive in determining the effectiveness and need for improvements of policies that have been enacted to encourage greater local business and local minority business participation and increase local business capacity; and

WHEREAS, many local businesses have expressed an interest in having a formal venue for providing constructive input to local policy makers regarding the effect of policies that impact local business opportunities in public and private sector procurement and local business capacity generally; and

WHEREAS, offering a consistent opportunity for policy feedback for our local business community may encourage greater participation in County certification efforts, procurement opportunities, and capacity building initiatives; and

opportunities for local business and local minority business participation and local business capacity building is an extremely important priority for the County;

WHEREAS, Section 506 of the County Charter provides that the County Council may appoint, for designated periods, temporary citizen advisory boards to assist in the consideration of County policies and programs.

WHEREAS, over the next five (5) years, since the County will foster over \$4 billion in

private and public sector development projects, ensuring that these projects provide significant

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee to the County Council is hereby established.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee shall be composed of nineteen (19) voting members appointed by the County Council Chairman in consultation with the Council. The MBE Compliance Manager to the County Council shall serve as the Chairperson of the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee. Additionally, the Council Chairman shall appoint a Council Member to be an ex-officio (non-voting) member of the committee. The voting membership of the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee shall consist of:

- (1) The MBE Compliance Manager to the County Council, who shall serve as the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee Chairperson;
- (2) Eight (8) County-based minority business enterprises actively seeking procurement opportunities in the region;
- (3) Three (3) experienced business enterprises, each with at least one office in the County, actively seeking procurement opportunities in the region;
 - (4) One (1) representative selected by the Prince George's Chamber of Commerce;
 - (5) One (1) representative selected by the Greater Prince George's Business Roundtable;
 - (6) One (1) representative selected by the Director of Central Services;
- (7) One (1) representative selected by the Prince George's County Economic Development Corporation;
- (8) One (1) representative selected by the Prince George's Financial Services Corporation (FSC First);
 - (9) One (1) representative selected by the Prince George's Community College's Center

for Entrepreneurial Development; and

(10) One (1) representative selected by the Maryland Building Industry Association.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee will collect and discuss feedback from stakeholders in the local business community concerning the progress of local business and local minority business participation in public and private sector procurement opportunities, local business capacity building efforts, and related policies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee shall collect, review and discuss available data and other information related to the implementation of policies that impact local business and local minority business participation in public and private sector procurement opportunities and local business capacity building efforts and give input to the County Council and the County Executive on such policies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee may also review and consider issues recommended by members of the County Council or the County Executive.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee shall meet publicly at least bi-monthly (once every two (2) months), as determined by the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee Chairperson, and, upon an affirmative vote of a majority of its members present at a public meeting, the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee may make formal recommendations or proposals. The Local Business Participation Advisory Committee Chairperson may request information on the committee's behalf or at the committee's direction. The necessary quorum for the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee to hold a public meeting is ten (10) voting members.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee shall transmit to the Clerk of the Council for delivery to the members of the County Council an annual written report approved by an affirmative vote of a majority of its members present at a public meeting assessing the progress and opportunities for improvement of policies that have been enacted to encourage greater local business and local minority business participation and increase local business capacity. This written report shall be transmitted annually within ninety (90) days of the end of each fiscal year beginning in 2015 and be accompanied by a public briefing to the County Council by the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee. The County Council may request and receive more frequent feedback or briefings from the Local

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Business Participation Advisory Committee at the Council's discretion.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the term of service for voting members of the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee shall be four (4) years, subject to reappointment to one (1) year terms of service.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council Administrator shall assign appropriate technical and administrative support personnel to assist the Local Business Participation Advisory Committee in its work.
