For the purpose of expressing the County Council's strong support for protecting access to				
quality, affordab	le heal	th care provided to millions of Americans and thousands of Prince		
George's County	reside	ents by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.		
WHEREAS,	the Pa	tient Protection and Affordable Care Act, commonly called the		
Affordable Care Act ("ACA"), or "Obamacare," one of then-President Barack Obama's				
centerpiece initiatives, was adopted in 2010 to dramatically reduce the number of uninsured				
Americans and in	mprove	e overall public health for the American people; and		
WHEREAS, the ACA protects our working families against health insurance discrimination				
and denial for pre-existing conditions, provides subsidies to working families to offset the cost of				
health insurance,	, incent	tivizes states to expand Medicaid coverage for the working poor, and		
requires coverage of basic family health care needs in health insurance plans; and				
WHEREAS, because of the ACA, more than 400,000 Marylanders have gained health				
insurance covera	ige ove	er the past six (6) years and the cost of uncompensated care in Maryland		
was reduced by \$311 million between 2013 and 2015; and				
WHEREAS, the ACA currently benefits approximately 200,000 Prince George's County				
residents; and				
WHEREAS, the ACA, over the last six (6) years, has cut the overall uninsured rate in the				

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including reducing the number of uninsured residents in Prince George's County by 50% in just

United States from 15.7% to 8.6% and, among those ages 18-64, from 22.3% to 11.9%,

the last three (3) years; and

WHEREAS, a 2012 Families USA study shows that more than 130,000 Americans died between 2005 and 2010 because of their lack of health insurance; and

WHEREAS, the high amount of uncompensated care in the County and the region has been a significant factor in the past financial challenges of Prince George's Hospital Center and Dimensions Healthcare System; and

WHEREAS, the Maryland Health Care Commission has approved plans by the University of Maryland Medical System and Dimensions Healthcare System, in partnership with the County and the State, to build a state-of-the-art Regional Medical Center ("UMMS Prince George's County Regional Medical Center") in Prince George's County, which will replace Prince George's Hospital Center and rebrand and significantly improve health care in the County and the region, while helping foster over \$3 billion in economic activity; and

WHEREAS, a significant increase in the uninsured rate and amount of uncompensated care in the County and the region due to the loss of health insurance coverage for working families because of any repeal of the ACA could undermine the "patient mix" of UMMS Prince George's County Regional Medical Center, potentially reducing the financial success of the facility and diminishing the quality of life of our residents; and

WHEREAS, the Congressional Budget Office recently estimated that the repeal of the ACA's health care subsidies, individual mandate, and Medicaid expansion, without replacement, would increase the number of Americans who are uninsured by 32 million by 2026; and

WHEREAS, U.S. President Donald J. Trump and Republicans in the U.S. Congress have taken initial steps to repeal the ACA without first providing a better alternative for quality, affordable health care coverage to the working families of America and Prince George's County, endangering coverage for millions of Americans and creating widespread uncertainty in the economy; and

WHEREAS, the County Council, which also sits as the County Board of Health, believes that access to quality, affordable health care is a right, not a privilege, and is essential to the quality of life of working families everywhere; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of our federal, state and local officials to defend the issues and interests of their constituents, including advocating for access to quality, affordable health care coverage provided in the ACA; and

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the County Council vigorously opposes the repeal of the Affordable Care Act and replacing it with an alternative that would not improve access to quality, affordable health care for all of our residents.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council opposes any measure that (i) results in a loss of health insurance coverage by any American, (ii) weakens the ACA's protection against health insurance discrimination or denial based on preexisting conditions, (iii) reduces the ACA's subsidies to individuals for buying health care, or (iv) reduces the incentives for states to cover individuals through expanding Medicaid.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council calls on Maryland Governor Larry Hogan to utilize his unique position as a Republican Governor to formally and persistently urge President Trump and Republican Members of the U.S. Congress to (i) protect the health care of Maryland residents enrolled in health coverage due to the Affordable Care Act and (ii) not repeal the ACA without adopting an alternative that improves access to quality, affordable health care for Maryland families, especially the working poor.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council urges the Maryland Congressional Delegation, Maryland General Assembly, and members of the general public to oppose and resist any weakening of the protections of the Affordable Care Act for working families.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be expeditiously sent to the President of the United States, U.S. Speaker of the House, U.S. Senate Majority Leader, U.S. House Minority Leader, U.S. Senate Minority Leader, Maryland Congressional Delegation, Governor of Maryland, President of the Maryland Senate, and Speaker of the Maryland House.
