10A-114 Contract Negotiations

Why We use Contract Negotiations:

- Only one supplier or available source
- When there are patent rights, copyrights, secret process, or control of basic raw material
- When the procurement is for technical, non-personal services in connection with the assembly, installation, or servicing of equipment of a highly technical or specialized nature
- When the procurement is for parts or components being procured as replacement parts in support of equipment specially designed by the same manufacturer, and it is determined that a substitute part will not perform the same function
- When the procurement involves construction where a contractor is already at work on the site and it would be impractical to change




Why We Use Contract Negotiations (Continued)

- When property is required for experiments, tests, development, or research in conjunction with determining the relative merits of the product or property for subsequent buys
- When only one product will meet technical and performance requirements for the procurement
- When it is determined in writing that competitive sealed bidding cannot be used in awarding a contract because an unanticipated emergency leaves insufficient time to use competitive methods

OCS Process for Contract Negotiations

- Agency submits request to the Purchasing Agent
- Request is tasked to assigned Procurement Officer with a response time
- Supplier Development and Diversity Division (SDDD) Recommendation Form is completed and submitted to SDDD
- Based on research and recommendations from SDDD, full approval may be granted, denied, or approved with conditions
- A response is sent to the agency by the Purchasing Agent



Opportunities for Improvement:

- Agency collaboration to assure that agencies understand the new legislation
- When utilizing state riders, OCS can take an extra step and choose approved suppliers who are County-based
- Continue to recruit suppliers who are County-based



Local Business Participation Plan

- Develop targeted recruitment plan to identify Countybased businesses
 - Identify unique organizations
- Expand recruitment efforts that include organizations and other groups where there are supplier gaps
 - Prince George's Chamber of Commerce; Women of Prince George's County; Women Business Owners of Prince George's County; NSBE; National Association of Power Engineers; Maryland Builders Industry Association; Fraternity & Sororities



Local Business Participation Plan (Continued)

- Enhance public/private partnerships; Create deeper relationships within both sectors in an effort to increase exposure to a wide spectrum of procurement opportunities
- Increase outreach efforts
 - Participate in/Partner with Prince George's County Chamber of Commerce events
 - Meet with County Council members to create and execute councilmanic outreach activities
 - Develop and execute a "Biz Now" format (connect suppliers to procurement opportunities)
 - Conduct popular training session more frequently
 - Continue to hold monthly certification workshops



Local Business Participation Plan

- Increase training efforts
 - Assess training initiatives
 - Partner with Prince George's Community College to create a second workshop series
- Become more of a partner versus a participant
 - Move from the audience to the stage
