POSITION STATEMENT

(SB 406) Senator Peters

Election Law – Voting Systems – Optical Scanners in Prince George's County

POSITION: SUPPORT

SB 406 Election Law – Voting Systems – Optical Scanners in Prince George's County requires that the voting system acquired by the State Board of Elections (SBE) for voting in polling places include at least two optical scanners for each polling place in Prince George's County. The supplemental equipment in Prince George's County must be included in SBE regulations specifying required supplies and equipment for the voting system.

This Council understands that underfunded election areas can result in long lines at polling places, requiring some voters to either wait hours to cast a ballot or to forgo their right to vote in that election. Voters who cannot wait the required amount of time are therefore effectively disenfranchised, while voters in well-funded areas with sufficient voting resources may face minimal or no waiting time. SB 406 seeks to address this concern through additional equipment aimed to help alleviate wait times. During the 2016 general election, the County had two scanners at nearly half of our polling locations. The Council realizes that more equipment is needed in order to better accommodate the needs of our citizens. Adding an additional scanner at the locations that are currently utilizing one scanner is expected to reduce waiting periods County-wide, which could lead to increased voter participation.

The bill imposes a fiscal mandate of approximately \$120,000 annually on Prince George's County, which we look forward to discussing with our Delegation to ensure the needs of our of citizens are met and maintained.

SB 406 is designed to improve the flow of voters by reducing wait times during our elections, and therefore the County Council offers its **SUPPORT**. We respectfully request your favorable consideration of our position.
