SECTION 1.	BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,

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1	DIVISION 12A. FURECLUSED PROPERTY REGISTRY ENFORCEMENT.
2	Sec. 13-1105.01 Definitions.
3	In this Division, the following words have the meanings indicated:
4	(a) Foreclosed Property Registry means the Foreclosed Property Registry established by
5	the Maryland Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation as required by Section 14-126.1,
6	Real Property Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.
7	(b) Foreclosure purchaser means the person identified as the purchaser on the report of sale
8	required by Maryland Rule 14-305 for foreclosure sale of residential property.
9	Sec. 13-1105.02. Foreclosure registration required.
10	A foreclosure purchaser shall submit any required registration to the Foreclosed Property
11	Registry as prescribed by Section 14-126.1, Real Property Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.
12	Sec. 13-1105.03. Penalties.
13	For [any violation of this Division,] failure to register a property as required under Section14-
14	126.1, Real Property Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, the Director of the Department of
15	Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement or the Director's designee [shall] may impose a civil
16	penalty of \$1,000. [for an initial or repeat violation.] [Each calendar day that a foreclosure
17	purchaser is in violation of this Division for a property shall constitute a separate violation.
18	Unpaid penalties under this Section at the end of any calendar year shall become a tax lien on the
19	subject property.]
20	Sec. 13-1105.04. Compliance by Existing Foreclosure Purchasers.
21	Persons who were foreclosure purchasers prior to the effective date of this Act shall submit
22	any outstanding registration to the Foreclosed Property Registry required by Section 14-126.1,
23	Real Property Article, Annotated Code of Maryland within thirty (30) days after the effective
24	date of this Act or be penalized in accordance with Section 13-1105.03 of this Division.
25	SECTION 2. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
26	Maryland, that Section 28-259 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby
27	repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

31	Sec. 28-259. Proceedings before the District Court.

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(b) With the exception of violations pursuant to Sections 13-246, 13-271, 13-1105.03, or 23-150 of the Code, and the tax lien placed on the property per Section 13-246.02 or Section 13-269 of the Prince George's County Code, which shall be paid in full to Prince George's County through the Office of Finance before transfer or sale of the property, upon a finding of a violation the civil fine imposed by the Court shall be in an amount deemed appropriate by the Court but shall not be less than the total amount in the schedule contained in Section 28-111 of this Division. With the exception of violations pursuant to Sections 13-246, 13-271, 13-1105.03, or 23-150 of the Code, the Court may suspend or defer the payment of the civil fine upon such reasonable grounds as the Court determines. Upon a finding of a violation pursuant to Sections 13-246, 13-271, or 23-150 of the Code, the civil fine imposed by the Court shall be strictly in accordance with the fines prescribed in Sections 13-246, 13-271, 13-1105.03, and 23-150 of the Code.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that revenue generated by the imposition of penalties under this Act shall be remitted back to the budget of the Department of Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
