#### **EXPLANATION OF ADJUSTMENTS**

#### Office of Central Services

The Pepco/Exelon merger recently awarded an additional \$5,048,200 in funding for the Energy Star and Green Leasing program which will assist in making existing commercial buildings in the County, more energy efficient and eligible for Energy Star certification requirements. Additionally funding in the amount of \$310,000 will support the Sustainable Energy Workforce Development program which seeks to establish workforce training and certification programs in partnership with institutions of higher education. Lastly, funding in the amount of \$5,681,200 will be used to support the Transforming Neighborhoods Initiative (TNI) Clean Energy Program which will provide grants to County residents in an effort to make their homes more energy efficient.

## Circuit Court

The Maryland Administrative Office of the Courts through the Maryland Judicial Center awarded \$10,990 in additional funding for the Adult/Juvenile/Re-Entry/Veterans Court program. The funds support salary and benefits for grant-funded court positions limited to the Problem-Solving Court coordinator and case manager(s).

The Maryland Department of Human Resources provided additional funding in the amount of \$48,213 to support child support enforcement services provided by the Circuit Court.

Additionally, an adjustment of (\$16,503) is needed to align with the revised cash matching requirements associated with this program.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded funding in the amount of \$385,775 for the Seeking Justice, Restoring Hope project. Funding provides for general operational support for the Family Justice Center.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded funding in the amount of \$6,900 for the Centralized Intake System. Funding will support development and implementation strategies intended to provide assistance to victims of crime.

#### Orphans' Court

The Maryland Judiciary, Administrative Office of the Courts awarded \$70,124 for the Alternative Dispute Resolution for Probate Matters Program. Funding supports mediation and settlement conferences in support of a collaborative law process for probate matters. Funding will support one limited term grant funded Community Developer position and operating expenses.

# Office of the State's Attorney

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded an additional \$225,034 for the Bilingual Victim Advocacy Grant (VOCA). Funding provides services and support to victims of property crime, domestic violence, sexual assault and other violent crimes in the County.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded \$1,500,000 for the Domestic Violence Program. Funding provides Supportive Assistance and Financial Empowerment (SAFE) solutions to battered women and their children. Services include housing options, increased protection, wrap around support services and financial assistance for the victims.

#### Police Department

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded an additional \$4,000 for the Sex Offenders Compliance and Enforcement Initiative. Funding supports the Department's compliance with State and federal regulations regarding the mandatory registration of convicted sex offenders that reside in the County.

The Target Corporation provided funding in the amount of \$9,500 for the purchase of two stereomicroscopes which will be used to take high quality digital photographs to document evidence.

The U.S. Department of Justice provided funding in the amount of \$44,100 to assist with incident based reporting needs. Funds will help with reprogramming efforts for the existing Records Management System.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency provided additional funding in the amount of \$365,000 for the UASI Tactical Equipment program. Funds will be used for the purchase of quick response vehicles and night goggles for the SWAT Unit.

#### Fire/EMS Department

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency provided funding in the amount of \$114,900 for the "Securing the Cities" Initiative. This program helps to establish radiological threat detection capabilities in the National Capital Region.

#### Office of the Sheriff

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded \$60,000 requiring a county match of \$15,000 for the Special Victims' Assistant Program. Funding supports services that assist victims of domestic violence with immediate intervention, safety planning, court accompaniment, and resources.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded \$30,000 for Warrant Sweeps, which will defray overtime costs incurred as a result of required warrant services to offenders.

#### **Department of Corrections**

The Department of Justice, Byrne – Justice Assistance Grant through the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded \$75,000 for the Reentry Assessment program. Funding provides evidence-based offender intake assessment tools to improve service provision through collaborative community based partnerships with the County's Health Department and Department of Social Services, as well as other private and non-profit entities. Funding will support personnel and software expenses.

The U.S. Department of Justice awarded \$319,200 for the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Grant – Local Solicitation for the Police Department, Fire/EMS, Department of Corrections, Sheriff Department, Office of Homeland Security and State's Attorney Office. Under this grant, the Sheriff's Civil Disturbance Unit desires to purchase equipment designated by the Justice Department as controlled equipment. Through this grant, the Civil Disturbance Unit will

purchase 15 riot helmets, 15 riot shields, 15 riot gloves, 15 riot batons, 15 gas mask pouches, 15 knee pads, 15 Flex force riot control suits, 15 shin guards, 15 elbow pads. This equipment will be used for training purposes and also when deployment has to occur in a riot and/or other civil disturbance within the County and/or State.

# Office of Homeland Security

The Maryland Emergency Management Agency provided an additional \$5 for the State Homeland Security program. Funding is used to support the County's ability to prevent, deter and respond to threats and incidents of terrorism.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency provided additional funding in the amount of \$1,671 for the Exercise and Training Officer Program, which supports the coordination and execution of Homeland Security exercises.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency provided additional funding in the amount of \$1,671 for the NIMS Compliance Officer Program. Funding supports a dedicated position(s) in this area to assist with required training exercise coordination needs.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency provided additional funding in the amount of \$90,000 for the Radio Communications Encryption Program which supports software for enhanced radio encryption.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency provided additional funding in the amount of \$6,831 for the Regional Planner Program. Funding supports planning efforts to ensure coordinated operational response capabilities in the event of regional emergencies and disasters.

#### Department of Family Services

The Department of Juvenile Services (DJS) awarded \$27 in additional funding for the Multi-Systemic Therapy (DJS) program. Funding supports an intensive family and community based treatment model that addresses the multiple determinants of serious antisocial behavior in juvenile offenders.

The Governor's Office for Children (GOC) awarded \$22 in additional funding for the Community Partnership Agreement (CPA), which supports administrative costs for the Division for Children, Youth and Families.

The Governor's Office for Children (GOC) awarded \$15 in additional funding for the Kinship Care program. Funding is provided to addresses the therapeutic and concrete needs of non-parental relative caretakers and their families as they work toward permanency plans for children in their care.

The Governor's Office for Children (GOC) awarded \$21 in additional funding for the Local Access Mechanism program. Funding is provided for Prince George's County to act as the central point of access for services for children, youth and their families. In addition, case management services are provided via a Service Navigator.

The Governor's Office for Children approved the use of Earned Reinvestment funds in the amount of \$65,008 to support the City of Greenbelt Youth Service Bureau.

The Governor's Office for Children approved the use of Earned Reinvestment funds in the amount of \$56,000 to support the District Heights Youth Service Bureau.

The Governor's Office for Children approved the use of Earned Reinvestment funds in the amount of \$13,916 to support the Prince George's County Memorial Library System.

The Corporation for National and Community Service awarded \$1 in additional funding for the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP). Funding supports training and technical assistance activities to develop volunteer service opportunities in County government and with non-profit agencies for approximately 600 older county citizens (55+). An adjustment in the amount of \$3,000 is needed to reflect county matching funds that will be provided to support this

initiative.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$343 in additional funding for the Senior Health Insurance Program (SHIP). Funding is provided to support trained volunteers that provide free health insurance counseling to seniors.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$24,741 in additional funding for the Senior Information and Assistance Program. Funding maintains a single point of contact for senior citizens who need information and assistance navigating and accessing services.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$393 in additional funding for the Senior Medicare Patrol Program. Funding is provided to reduce federal and State funds lost due to health insurance fraud by increasing the public's ability to detect and report possible fraud, waste and abuse.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$1,930 in additional funding for the Vulnerable Elderly Program. Funding is provided to support the efforts of the Guardianship Program which ensures the provision of optimum care/services for adjudicated wards of the court with professional case management.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$2,695 in additional funding for the Ombudsman Initiative. Funding provides for complaint investigations and advocacy services to all residents living in long term care licensed assisted living facilities, group homes, and nursing homes.

The Maryland Department of Aging, through the Older Americans Act of 1965, awarded \$31,562 in additional funding for the Title III-C2: Nutrition for the Elderly Home Delivered Meals program.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene consolidated funding for the Home Visiting Expansion Program (\$218,100) with funding for the Home Visiting Expansion/Home Visiting Pilot Grant resulting in an adjustment of \$309,716. Funding provides high quality home

visiting services to 60 at-risk families residing in one of the identified catchment areas; Bladensburg, District Heights, Hyattsville, Mount Rainier, Riverdale, Suitland or Upper Marlboro. The program incorporates a central intake component that utilizes community partnerships and interagency collaborations to provide access to multiple services across the spectrum of needs.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$28,278 in additional funding for the Senior Care program which provides coordinated, community-based, in-home services to seniors with disabilities who may be at risk of nursing home placement.

The Maryland Department of Aging provided funding in the amount of \$80,000 for the MAP Hospital to Home Grant. This program supports seniors transitioning from acute care or short term rehabilitation care to home or community based settings.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded funding in the amount of \$23,088 to support the Medicare Improvements for Patients and Providers Act (MIPAA). Funds assist the Department in assisting seniors and individuals with disabilities with enrollment in Medicare Part D subsidy programs.

#### Health Department

The Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded an additional \$58,405 for the Continuum of Care grant. Funding will support services for people living with HIV/AIDS. This program consists of HIV prevention, treatment, care and support services.

The Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded an additional \$21 for the Federal Block Grant. Funding provides assistance to consumers who are in crisis and to elderly consumers with special needs.

The Anne Arundel County Mental Health Agency awarded an additional \$19 for the Crownsville Program. Funding will be used to offer specific comprehensive community based mental health services available to eligible children, adolescents and adults.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded an additional \$10 for Project Safety Net. Funding will support the reduction of substance abuse to prevent entry to the criminal justice system and recidivism.

The Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded an additional \$8,625 for the Tobacco Implementation Project. Funding will support tobacco education and prevention through community outreach.

The Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded \$15,000 for the Ebola Virus Disease Preparedness grant. Funding will support Zika outreach related activities.

The Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded an additional \$45 for the High Risk Infants grant. Funding will provide early intervention services to new mothers and their infants who are at risk of poor health outcomes, with the goal of maximizing their health and well-being.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded an additional \$20 for the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program. Funding will provide nutrition education and selected supplemental foods to low income pregnant, breastfeeding and postpartum women and children ages birth to five identified to have nutritional risks.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene, Infectious Disease Prevention and Health Services Bureau awarded an additional \$111,246 for the Sexually Transmitted Disease Caseworker Program. Funding provides accessible, comprehensive and coordinated HIV medical services, encouraging the continuity of care and improving health outcomes.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene, Behavioral Health Administration awarded \$15,600 for the Overdose Education and Naloxone Distribution Programs. Funding supports overdose education and Naloxone distribution.

An adjustment in the amount of \$499,947 is needed to support the collections of the Ambulatory Funding Program. Collection fees support outpatient and residential treatment to County residents with substance abuse problems.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded \$500 in additional funding for the Oral Health Clinical Care Program. Funding provides for dental services provided by the Deamonte Driver Dental Van.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded \$2,492,500 for the Ryan White Part B Grant. Funding provides HIV/AIDS clients with accessible, comprehensive and coordinated HIV services aimed at encouraging continuity of care and improving health outcomes through partnerships with community based organizations and specialty providers.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded \$60,000 in additional funding for the Immunization Action Grant. This program provides immunization services to County uninsured children and maintains the current level of morbidity from vaccine preventable diseases.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health and Hygiene awarded \$27,260 in additional funding for the Administrative Care Coordination Grant – Ombudsman Program. Funding provides services to County residents who are enrolled in (or who may be eligible for) Medical Assistance. This program helps clients navigate the system and access their health care benefits and local community resources. Community outreach and education to health care providers and the community is also provided.

The U.S. Department of Justice awarded \$997,302 for the Prince George's County Smart Reentry Grant. Funding provides evidence-based strategies for successful reentry from incarceration to community units or components of county or city local government agencies serving adults.

The Geriatrics Evaluation and Review Services Program anticipates \$119,138 in additional fees will be collected as a result the program's ability to close additional cases. Funding will provide comprehensive evaluations for aged and functionally disabled adults who need long term care and are at risk for institutionalization.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded \$15,000 for the Zika Grant. Funding is provided to address Zika planning and operational response gaps and to enable jurisdictions to provide emergency management response support.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded \$51,934 in additional funding for the Recovery Support Services Grant. Funding provides for a Recovery Support Coordinator for the Pregnancy/Post-Partum Project. This project is designed to assist pregnant and post-partum women who have an opioid or other substance use disorder with navigating the service delivery system, assisting wrap-around service provision and recovery supports.

#### Department of Social Services

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development awarded \$33,057 in additional funding for the Success Rapid Re-Housing program. Funding provides for homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing which supports short term rental assistance in an effort to prevent homelessness.

The Maryland Department of Human Resources awarded \$34,476 in additional funding for the Office of Home Energy Programs. Funding assists low-income families in meeting the high costs of winter energy bills. Benefits are distributed to utilities, fuel suppliers, and landlords on behalf of needy families (those with incomes at or below 150% of the Federal Poverty Level).

The Maryland Department of Human Resources awarded \$7,337 in additional funding for the Food Stamp Employment and Training/Able Bodied Adults without Dependents Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (FSET/ABAWD/SNAP). Funding assists food stamp recipients in attaining long-term self-sufficiency through suitable employment.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development awarded \$87,588 in additional funding for the Continuum of Care (CoC) Planning Project-1. Funding provides for two full-time exempt positions to assist with the implementation and evaluation of the 10 year plan to prevent and end homelessness.

The Maryland Department of Human Resources awarded \$25,000 in additional funding for the Foster Youth Employment Program. This program is part of the existing Welfare Reform-Work Opportunities Program. Funding provides employment-related assistance to clients of various benefit programs. Job development, referrals, placements, and job-seeking skills training are some of the components of this initiative, which seeks to reduce welfare dependency through employment.

The Maryland Department of Human Resources awarded \$53 in additional funding for the Emergency and Transitional Housing Services program. Funding is provided for the operation of emergency shelters, transitional housing programs, rent/mortgage subsidies and hotline services.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) awarded \$38 in additional funding for the Emergency Food and Shelter program. Funding is provided to ensure crisis assistance for rental, mortgage and utility assistance for low-income households to prevent homelessness.

The Maryland Department of Human Resources awarded \$1,000 in additional funding for the Maryland Emergency Food Program. Funding provides short-term temporary food assistance to eligible clients.

The Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development awarded \$73,785 for the Emergency Solutions Grant. Funding supports costs directly related to homeless prevention, rapid re-housing, street outreach, maintenance, staffing, and administration including costs for case management and client services.

The Prince George's County Public Schools awarded \$82,000 for the Child Protective Services Clearance Screening Grant. Funding is provided to ensure a comprehensive approach for background checks that is inclusive of child abuse and neglect findings for potential employees, volunteers and vendors.

The Maryland Department of Human Resources awarded \$1,513 in additional funding for the Child Advocacy Centers/Enhancement Project. Funding provides assistance to child sexual assault victims and their families. In addition, it offers counseling to non-offending caregivers and adult survivors of child sexual abuse, render medical expertise in the evaluation of child sexual abuse and supports training opportunities.

The Maryland Department of Human Resources awarded \$65,800 in additional funding for the Family Investment Administration (FIA) Temporary Administrative Support Grant. Specifically, the funding is provided to hire additional staff to address timeliness issues relating to the processing of benefits for the Temporary Cash Assistance, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (formerly known as Food Stamps), Temporary Disability Assistance, and Medical Assistance programs.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded \$31,500 for the Child Protection Education Unit Grant. Funding provides child protection education to various audiences throughout the County in an effort to raise awareness and identify signs of child abuse and neglect.

#### Department of the Environment

The Maryland Department of the Environment awarded funding in the amount of \$12,000 for the e-Cycling program which will assist the County in recycling computers, video display devices, and other electronic goods in order to save valuable landfill capacity.

#### Department of Public Works and Transportation

The Maryland Transit Administration provided funding in the amount of \$1,000,000 to assist with the purchase of buses and signs.

The Maryland Transit Administration awarded additional funding in the amount of \$19 for the Statewide Specialized Transportation Assistance Program which requires that an additional contribution of \$840 in matching funds from the County.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Community Development (HUD) awarded an additional \$8,300 in Home Investment Partnership (HOME) funds to the County. Additionally, our local DHCD reduced the HOME entitlement funds by \$522,900 in an effort to reflect the payment required by the Voluntary Grant Reduction plan. Since the adoption of the Annual Action Plan (AAP) via CR-16-2016, HUD notified the County that our AAP needed to be revised to reflect the full federal HOME entitlement amount resulting in an overall adjustment of \$531,200. The redistribution of funds will be result in an increase to the existing My HOME Homebuyer Activities program budget in the amount of \$65,521 and \$465,949 for the Home Investment Partnership program budget.
