	Public Safety Surcharge
For the purpose	of adjusting the public safety surcharge for Fiscal Year 2018, beginning July 1,
2017, as required	l by State law.
WHEREAS	S, pursuant to Section 10-192.11(a) of the Prince George's County Code the
County Council,	by ordinance, may impose a public safety surcharge on new residential
construction for	which a Preliminary Plan has been approved on or after July 1, 2005; and
WHEREAS	S, pursuant to Section 10-192.11(b)(1)(A) and Section 10-192.11(b)(1)(B) of the
Prince George's	County Code, for Fiscal Year 2006, a public safety surcharge imposed on a
single-family de	tached dwelling, townhouse, or dwelling unit for any other building containing
more than a sing	le dwelling unit shall be in the amount of \$6,000; except the amount shall be
\$2,000 if the cor	struction is located in the Developed Tier, as defined by the Maryland-National
Capital Park and	Planning Commission in the 2002 Prince George's County Approved General
Plan; and	
WHEREAS	S, pursuant to Section 4-352 of the Prince George's County Code for Fiscal Year
2007 and each su	acceeding fiscal year, the public safety surcharge established in Section
4-352 shall be ac	ljusted for inflation in accordance with the Consumer Price Index for All Urban
Consumers publ	ished by the United States Department of Labor, for the fiscal year preceding the
year for which th	ne amount is being calculated; and
WHEREAS	S, pursuant to Section 4-352 of the Prince George's County Code, the County
Council, by reso	lution, shall adjust the surcharge each year by the percentage change in the

Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers published by the United States Department of

Labor from the previous fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 684 of the 2013 Laws of Maryland, the Developed Tier shall be defined by the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission in the Prince George's County Approved General Plan, and the public safety surcharge imposed on construction located in the Developed Tier shall be imposed on construction located in an area included in a certain basic or conceptual site plan that abuts an existing or planned mass transit rail station site operated by the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority and that complies with the requirements of any sector plan, master plan or overlay zone approved by the Prince George's County District Council; and

WHEREAS, the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers from April 2016 to April 2017, the most recent published data for the preceding fiscal year, is 2.2%, and results in an increase of \$54 above the Fiscal Year 2017 public safety surcharge of \$2,461 for permits issued inside the Developed Tier and inside an area included in a certain basic or conceptual site plan, and an increase of \$162 above the Fiscal Year 2017 public safety surcharge of \$7,379 for permits issued for all other buildings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that for Fiscal Year 2018, the public safety surcharge shall be \$2,515 for permits issued for construction located inside the Developed Tier, as defined by the Maryland – National Capital Park and Planning Commission in the Prince George's County Approved General Plan and for construction in an area included in a basic plan or conceptual site plan that abuts an existing or planned mass transit rail station site operated by the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority and that complies with the requirements of any sector plan, master plan or overlay zone approved by the Prince George's County District Council. The public safety surcharge shall be \$7,541 for all other buildings, be and the same is hereby approved, and shall be retroactively effective July 1, 2017.
