RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

Waiver Approval for Procurement of greater than \$500,000 For the purpose of approving the waiver of the participation requirement of at least forty percent (40%) certified County-Based Small Businesses (CBSB) in procurements greater than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) pursuant to Section 10A-161(a)(1) of the Prince George's County Code (Code).

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 10A-161(a)(1) of the Code, any procurements in which the Prince George's County government secures competitive bids or proposals pursuant to Sections 10A-112 and 10A-113 of the Code and that are greater than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) requires at least forty percent (40%) certified CBSB participation; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 10A-161(a)(1) of the Code, the Purchasing Agent must determine if there are insufficient responsible CBSB to completely fulfill the forty percent (40%) certified CBSB participation requirement for a procurement; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 10A-161(a)(1) of the Code, the Purchasing Agent may waive the requirement upon approval by Council Resolution and concurrence of the County Executive; and

WHEREAS, the Purchasing Agent received requests from Departments for waivers, as described in Attachments A-1 and A-2 attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the Purchasing Agent conducted a search to identify responsible CBSB and County-Based Businesses (CBB) that could provide the services or goods which are the subject of a procurement of more than \$500,000; and



WHEREAS, the Purchasing Agent conducted a search to identify responsible CBSB and

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WHEREAS, the search did not identify sufficient responsible CBSB, including businesses that qualify for automatic CBSB certification pursuant to Section 10A-163(g) of the Code, as evidenced by Attachments A-1 and A-2; and

WHEREAS, each Attachment contains a certification from the Executive Director of the Supplier Development and Diversity Division attesting to the search and results reflecting insufficient responsible CBSB; and

WHEREAS, each Attachment contains a certification from the Purchasing Agent that the waiver requests are in compliance with Section 10A-161(a)(1) of the Code; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive concurs with the requests for waivers, as described in Attachments A-1 and A-2; and

WHEREAS, the Council further finds that the approval of such waivers necessitating Council action are plainly in the public interest and essential for the seamless continuation of governmental functions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, in accordance with Section 10A-161(a)(1) of the Prince George's County Code, grants the request to waive the forty percent (40%) certified CBSB requirement for any procurement of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) or more, described in in Attachments A-1 and A-2 are hereby APPROVED.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall be become effective as of the date of its adoption.

TERM SHEET

Solicitation: Bloodbourne Pathogens and Occupational Employee Medical Services

Annual Contract Value: \$1,500,000

Performance Term: Initial term of the agreement will be three (3) years and may be extended for two (2) additional one (1) year periods by mutual agreement of the parties.

Waiver Request: Request waiver of the 40% to 20% participation.

Background on Contract: Bloodborne Pathogens services are required by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) 29 CFR 1910.1030. The County is also required to provide Occupational Employee Medical Services. The contractor will provide all medical examinations and procedures for all applicants and employees. The contractor is required to have a facility located in Prince George's County with flexible operational hours with physicians and licensed healthcare professionals on staff, to perform medical examination and procedures. Public Safety personnel are required to undergo medical examination and follow-up examinations on an as-needed basis. Medical examinations are also required for employees in safety sensitive Department of Transportation positons. The contractor is required to provide workplace drug and alcohol tests for random, reasonable suspicion, post-accident and return to duty as required by the County. The contractor must be certified in Bloodborne Pathogens Infectious Control Diseases to provide medical evaluation and treatment to employees who experience an occupational exposure to human blood or other potentially infectious materials. The contractor must provide post-exposure notification, and available at all times to respond to infectious and non-infectious exposure issues, follow up 24-hours a day/365 days a year, provides an after hour hotline staffed by their employee(s), treatment plan if needed, provide vaccinations and skin tests.
