SECTION	1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
Maryland, that S	Sections 11-327, 11-328, and 11-329 of the Prince George's County Code be and

Sec. 11-327. Be	enefits to fire companies and rescue squads.
(a) The Council	il shall levy a tax to provide for [the payment of disability benefits to an
member and	d death pensions to a widow and/or minor legitimate children of any member of
the voluntee	er fire departments and rescue squads of the County who are injured or killed in
the line of o	duty as a fireman or rescue squadsman] a Blanket Life and Accident Insuranc

Policy covering the members of all volunteer fire departments and rescues squads in the County. This policy shall provide for death benefits, disability benefits, medical expenses benefits, family assistance, and optional auxiliary and/or community volunteer coverage. Pursuant to the County's Blanket Life and Accident Insurance Policy, there shall be a minimum death benefit of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) payable upon the death of any member of a County volunteer fire department or rescue squad whose death results from a covered activity or illness in the Blanket Life and Accident Insurance Policy.

- (b) [The disability benefits or death benefits provided in this Section shall apply only to members of these volunteer fire departments or rescue squads whose equipment meets the standards as approved by the Council at the time of the injury or death.
- (c) Upon proof as may be required by the Council, any such member sustaining injuries in line of duty as a fireman or member of a rescue squad which injuries disable him from being gainfully employed, he shall be entitled to receive the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) per day during the continuance of such disability for a period not to exceed fifty-two (52) weeks. In the event the disability shall continue for a period longer than fifty-two (52) weeks he shall then be entitled to receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per month for the duration of the disability. In addition to the aforesaid payments, he shall be entitled to receive medical expenses, including hospitalization, up to the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).
- (d) In the event any such member is killed or disabled as a result of injuries in line of duty as a volunteer fireman or member of a rescue squad, his widow shall be entitled to receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per month so long as she lives and remains unmarried. Any legitimate minor child or children of the deceased shall each be entitled to receive the sum of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) per month until the child attains eighteen (18) years of age or marries. Such payments shall be made to the mother or guardian of the child or children or other person designated by the Council.] The Fire Department shall notify all active members of the volunteer fire departments and rescue squads of the benefits available under the County's Blanket Life and Accident Insurance Policy. Upon joining a volunteer fire department or rescue squad, a new member shall be oriented to the benefits available under this insurance policy.
- [(e)] (c) The Council shall adopt such rules and regulations as they deem necessary to administer the provisions of this Section.

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[(f)] (d) The Council may reduce any sums payable under this Section in an amount equal to the amount received by a beneficiary under the provisions of Article 101, Annotated Code of Maryland, entitled Workmen's Compensation.

Sec. 11-328. Length of Service Award Program.

(c) Benefits.

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(8) When a qualified volunteer dies after July 1, 2005, a burial benefit of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) shall be paid to the surviving spouse, and if there is no surviving spouse to the estate of the decedent. Effective July 1, 2014, and thereafter, the burial benefit shall be Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). [Effective July 1, 2014, and thereafter, the burial benefit shall be Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) for a qualified volunteer whose death results from an accidental personal injury arising out of and in the course of his volunteer service.] A qualified volunteer is defined as one who has completed twenty-five (25) years of service or is qualified to receive benefits under this Section.

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Sec. 11-329. Death Benefits.

- (a) There shall be a death benefit of [Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000)] Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) payable upon the death of any member of a County volunteer fire department or rescue squad [whose death results from an accidental personal injury arising out of and in the course of his services to Prince George's County]. This payment shall be a one time, lump sum and shall be paid within ten (10) calendar days from the date of the volunteer's death. It shall be paid to the person or persons specified by the volunteer in accordance with duly authorized personnel procedures of the County.
- (b) In addition, there shall be a line of duty death benefit for every year the member of a County volunteer fire department or rescue squad served over ten (10) years of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000) per year, and Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) per year for every year served over fifteen (15) years.
- (c) The death of any active member caused by lung disease, heart disease, hypertension, leukemia, prostate cancer, colorectal cancer, throat cancer, multiple myeloma, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, brain cancer, testicular cancer or breast cancer, shall be presumed to be service-connected and to have been suffered in the line of duty and as a result of his/her membership of

1	these volunteer fire departments or rescue squads unless evidence is produced which shall
2	demonstrate a reasonable degree of medical certainty that the member's death is not related to
3	their service in a volunteer fire department or rescue squad. This subsection shall apply to an
4	individual who completed at least ten (10) years of service as a firefighter, firefighting instructor,
5	rescue squad member, technical rescue basic life support unit member, or advanced life support
6	unit member, auxiliary member, administrative member or in a combination of those jobs in the
7	County. For purposes of this Subsection, an active member shall mean someone who has earned
8	at least fifty (50) Length of Service Award Program points. This Subsection shall only extend
9	medical presumption to the County death benefit outlined in Section 11-329(b), and shall not be
10	applied to Maryland Workers' Compensation Law for disability benefits.
11	(d) Subsection (c) shall only apply to those members who have completed a base line physical
12	to include screenings consistent with National Fire Protection Association ("NFPA") 1582
13	criteria for cancer, lung disease, heart disease, and hypertension; and shall submit documentation
14	of an annual physical to include screenings consistent with NFPA 1582 criteria for those meeting
15	the risk factor of a comprehensive screening for cancer, lung disease, heart disease, and
16	hypertension. The annual physical may be performed by a County vendor, or the member's
17	primary care physician at the expense of the member or the member's insurance. A copy of the
18	member's physical results will be sent to Fire Department Risk Management. The required
19	documentation from for the annual physical performed by a personal physician shall include a
20	checklist of required screenings consistent with Prince George's County and NFPA 1582
21	standards. A member may opt for additional tests and evaluations as directed by the member's
22	primary care physician. If a member chooses not to participate in the annual physical, it shall not
23	affect his or her volunteer status. A member's medical documents from an annual physical shall
24	become property of the Fire Department Risk Management and be subject to all medical record
25	review rules and regulations in concert with HIPPA, shall remain confidential, and shall not be
26	reviewed by the County without the express consent of the member. Former members who are
27	no longer volunteers shall qualify for a medical presumption under Subsection (c) if they meet
28	other eligibility requirements and were active members within the last five (5) years preceding
29	their diagnosis.
30	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby

declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,

sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act i	s declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of	
competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unc	onstitutionality shall not affect the remaining	
words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagra	aphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this	
Act, since the same would have been enacted	without the incorporation in this Act of any such	
invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clau-	se, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,	
or section.		
SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENAC	TED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)	
calendar days after it becomes law.
